1. CALL TO ORDER

The City Council of the City of Nevada, Iowa, met for a regular meeting in the Council Chambers located at City Hall, 1209 6th Street, Nevada, Iowa. Mayor Lynn Lathrop, convened the meeting at 6:00 p.m. on Monday, October 10, 2016, pursuant to the rules of the Council. Mike Neal noted staff has been working on storm sewer repairs. They are trying to finish as much patching before winter. They will also be flushing hydrants. He will be working with engineers on upcoming projects.

Ric Martinez updated the council on Director of Fire and EMS Ray Reynolds' condition. Reynolds is anticipated to be back mid November.

Kerin Wright advised the Employee Blood Draw is scheduled for Wednesday with the Health Fair with employees slated for Tuesday, October 18th. Wright updated council on the city administrator search and informed them of upcoming special council meetings November 7th, 17th and 18th. Council Development Committee is reviewing the DuPont Amendment and the ROSK Incentive Agreement. Lake Shore Drive issue will be on the next agenda. Wright will be out of the office Wednesday October 19th through Friday, 21st for the Iowa Municipal Finance Officer's Conference in Des Moines.

Larry Stevens reported they are looking at the 2017 street repair and televising the sanitary sewers. There are a few issues that may need repairs. More details will be provided at a later date. December 1st plans should be completed.
