NEW BUSINESS:

A. Discussion Regarding Park Set Aside for South Glen Subdivision and Appropriate Follow-up.

As the South Glen subdivision progresses we are once again talking about the park set aside; meaning, the subdivision would donate 5% of the land or the cash value in lieu of, or a combination of the two. The development is big enough (66 lots) to warrant a park, and because of the distance of the next closest park and a busy street, it would be logical to have a park in this area. Currently it would seem that a piece of playground equipment and a simple A-frame structure (shelter) would suffice for the development.

Outlot C appears to be an option, as it is somewhat centrally located and is good size. The only downfall would be ensuring the developer could grade the land in such a way to

accommodate a park area with a playground and shelter. Additionally, because outlot C is not 5% of the total development and it is an outlot for drainage, it may be an option to request a contribution towards the playground equipment and shelter for park.

Furthermore, an easement through the north end of the subdivision was also discussed to accommodate a possible pedestrian trail.

Motion by Board Member Parker, seconded by Board Member Griffith, to <u>recommend Outlot</u> <u>C for a park set aside area (if it can be graded for this purpose), in addition to a <u>contribution from the Developer to go towards the purchase of play equipment and a <u>shelter.</u> After due consideration and discussion the question was put upon the motion and the roll being called, the following named Board Members voted. Ayes: Griffith, Parker, Selby, Gross, Cahill, Miller. Nays: none.</u></u>
