RESOLUTION NO. 036 (2019/2020)

Resolution taking additional action on proposal to enter into a General Obligation Corporate Purpose Loan Agreement and authorizing the use of a preliminary official statement in connection therewith

WHEREAS, the City of Nevada (the "City"), in Story County, State of Iowa, pursuant to the provisions of Section 384.24A of the Code of Iowa, proposed to enter into a loan agreement (the "Loan Agreement") and to borrow money thereunder in a principal amount not to exceed \$9,000,000 for the purpose of paying the costs, to that extent, of constructing street, sidewalk, sanitary sewer, water system, storm water drainage, alley and sidewalk improvements; and acquiring and installing street lighting, signage and signalization improvements (the "Projects"), and has published notice of the proposed action and has held a hearing thereon on March 9, 2020; and

WHEREAS, a Preliminary Official Statement (the "P.O.S.") has been prepared by Dorsey & Whitney LLP (the "Disclosure Counsel") as bond and disclosure counsel to the City to facilitate the sale of General Obligation Corporate Purpose Bonds, Series 2020 (the "Bonds") in evidence of the obligation of the City under the Loan Agreement, and it is now necessary to make provision for the approval of the P.O.S. and to authorize its use by D.A. Davidson & Co., Des Moines, Iowa (the "Underwriter"), as the underwriter of the issuance of the Bonds;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the City Council of the City of Nevada, Iowa, as follows:

- Section 1. The City Council hereby determines to enter into the Loan Agreement in the future and to issue the Bonds at such time, in evidence thereof. The City Council further declares that this resolution constitutes the "additional action" required by Section 384.24A of the Code of Iowa.
- Section 2. The City Clerk is hereby authorized to take such action as shall be deemed necessary and appropriate, with the assistance of Disclosure Counsel and the Underwriter to prepare the P.O.S. describing the Bonds and providing for the terms and conditions of their sale, and all action heretofore taken in this regard is hereby ratified and approved.
- Section 3. The use by the Underwriter of the P.O.S. in substantially the form as has been presented to and considered by the City Council is hereby approved, and the Underwriter is hereby authorized to prepare and use a final Official Statement for the Bonds substantially in the form of the P.O.S. but with such changes therein as are required to conform the same to the terms of the Bonds and the resolution, when adopted, providing for the sale and issuance of the Bonds, and the City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to execute a final Official Statement for the Bonds, if requested. The P.O.S. as of its date is deemed final by the City within the meaning of Rule 15(c)(2)-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission.
- Section 4. Further action with respect to the Loan Agreement is hereby adjourned to the City Council meeting on March 23, 2020.

Section 5. All resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 6. This resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption and approval, as provided by law.




The Downtown Historical District was listed in the National Historical Register on May 9, 2003.

ABOUT THE TOUR

The self-guided walking tour of the Historic Downtown District begins at Nevada's City Hall corner park, located on the northeast corner of 6th Street and L Avenue/Historic Lincoln Highway.

From the corner park the tour proceeds south on the east side of 6th Street. This allows a full view of the buildings located on the "west" side of the street.

When arriving at J Avenue, cross to the west side of 6th Street to view the buildings located on the "east" side and walk north ending back at your starting point, the Nevada City Hall corner park.






Plaques on the downtown buildings mark their presence on the National Historical Register.

Note: L Avenue is part of the Historic Lincoln Highway which is also on the National Registry of Historic Places.

The walking tour is made possible through the efforts of the Nevada Historical Preservation Commission.



NEVADA DOWNTOWN HISTORIC DISTRICT

1202-1210 6th St. Padellford Block. A fine example of Late Victorian Italianate Style, this building was constructed ca. 1893 after FM and IH Padellford acquired the parcel. It was first used as retail shop space for a bakery, restaurant, and grocery with a stairway in the sidewalk outside to reach a basement barbershop. The sheet metal cornice is its most significant feature, with its embossed floral shaped designs set between boxed brackets with a wide crown molding along the upper edge.

1136 6th St. Belknap Block. As noted in the carved stone scroll, this double front was built in 1901. An example of Neo-Classical Revival Style, it is constructed of mottled reddish brown brick with a darker brown brick used for the piers that separate its three bays and the window arches. S.A. Belknap operated a furniture and carpet business, as well as an undertaking business. It subsequently housed a restaurant, grocery store, billiards hall, cinema and offices.

1114 6th St. Circle Theater. In 1928 this building was constructed in the Classical Revival Style by the Circle Amusement Company with Oscar Strine, a self promoter and showman himself, as co-owner. Operated as both a movie house and legitimate theater it boasted that vaudeville shows would appear along with movies Friday through Monday nights with "photo plays augmented by the pick of the unusual, in short novelties, choice comedies, and news reel flashes, by airmail direct".

1102-1104 6th St. Briggs Block. This prominent corner block is an example of Late Victorian Queen Anne Style. The metal cornice and corner turret are its most significant features. The conical turret roof is shaped with fluted sections terminating in a decorative finial. The corner portion has functioned as a drug store from its inception with Briggs Drugs followed in 1917 by W.L. Tipton and Sons Drug Store, which remained in business until the late 1990's. The north half contained a hardware and tin shop, Long & Sons Clothing, a newsstand with art sales and Cash Grocery Store. Tipton's expanded into this section in the early 1970's.

1024-1026 6th St.
Boyd and Childs Building. While the storefronts have been extensively remodeled, the second floor and cornice retain most of their Late Victorian Italianate Style. George Boyd and T.P. Child erected this building in 1881, following the fire of 1880 which destroyed a former building on this site. The partners operated a meat market here, with Mrs. W.J. Zahn operating a cigar factory on the second floor producing such brands as "Special Binder", "Magnolia", "Nevada Concert Bank" and "Maceo".

1018 6th St. Farmer's Bank. Est. in the 1870's by Otis Briggs, the Farmer's Bank was purchased by Jay G.

Dutton (Otis's son-in-law) and J.A. Mills in 1897. In 1920 this stone clad building was built to replace an earlier Italianate Style building on this site. Reorganized into the Farmers Trust and Savings Bank in 1928, the year both Dutton and Mills died, the bank closed in the early 1930's and the building was transferred in 1934 to the newly reorganized Nevada National Bank, the only local full service bank by 1936.

6th Street and J Avenue. Story County Courthouse. Erected in 1876 -1877 on the corner of Linn Street (6th St.) and Court Avenue (J Av.) the third Story County Courthouse was designed by prominent Des Moines architect William Foster. The mansard roofed brick and stone structure (non-extant) was built for \$40,000, its construction affirmed by county voters on the first referendum election two years earlier. The original structure stood in front of the current building, which was built while the old building stood and continued in use. On the south half of the block, on 6th Street, stood the Jail and Sheriff's residence, which was razed.

937 6th St. Story Hotel. Built as the result of efforts of the Nevada Community Club, the Story Hotel (also listed as Hotel Story) replaced the Hutchins Hotel that burned on July 15, 1908. The old Presbyterian Church on the south half of the lot was also razed to make room. A combination of Mission Style and Craftsman Style, it is a well preserved example of a commercial building in a style more commonly associated with domestic buildings. The hotel had a full dining room behind the lobby. The short mansard roof is covered with metal tile. The entrance is still covered by the original metal canopy.

1001–1003 6th St. Ringheim Block I.A. Ringheim, an immigrant from Norway, arrived in Nevada in 1865 and became a partner with Iver Johnson in a dry goods business (Johnson & Ringheim). The next year Mr. Ringheim was sole proprietor and in 1877 he initiated plans to expand. This included moving the frame building he had to allow him to continue business and build a new structure on the same land. The grand opening was on Nov. 1, 1887 at a cost of \$16,000.

1015 6th St. Sanitary Meat Market One of the best preserved examples of the trend of building new brick buildings to replace mid-block wooden structures or on vacant lots is this single storefront. Only 16 feet wide, it was most likely built on speculation by R.S. and Anna Patrick in 1913. While modified slightly through the years, it still retains the three section transom above the display windows. Many businesses were located here, with the best documented being the Sanitary Meat Market in 1927. Because of poor economic times, the building was sold at a sheriff's sale in 1935.

1036 7th St. First Methodist Episcopal Church. The first building, which was replaced by a brick structure at this location in 1893, was a frame structure located just south of the current church. That brick church burned down in 1930 and was eventually replaced by the current church, whose cornerstone was laid in May 1931 and completed the following October.

617 K Av. Nevada Poultry Co. Building. One of the last buildings constructed in the downtown area, this building was constructed next to the Nevada Public Library in 1928. Built in a vernacular Brick Front form, without reference to any specific architectural style, it is constructed of mottled tan and brown brick with an artificial stone coping along the parapet. On the storefront, only the inset signboard and door have been slightly modified.

1105 thru 1115 6th St. E.B. Patton Buildings. Constructed in 1887, the buildings are most noted for the occupant, Ambrose and Sons, a dry goods and clothing store headed by John Wesley Ambrose. His three sons, Harry, William, and Frank eventually joined the firm that had "The Big Store" as its motto. By 1890, father and sons were selling boots and shoes in the north store and general merchandise in the double front south store. In 1927, millinery goods were sold from 1105, dry goods 1109, men's furnishings 1111 and shoes at 1115. The store(s) were run by 4 generations of the family until closings in the late 1980's.

1117-1119 6th St. IOOF. On the second floor of this building in 1877 the International Order of the Odd Fellows Lodge #104 built a hall for their fraternal organization.

1133 6th St. Nevada Journal.
George and Oscar Benjamin,
editors and publishers, had the Journal
building constructed in 1905. The one-story brick building is a well preserved
example of a Classical Revival Style
design. It's light brown brick is trimmed
with dressed limestone. Four stone
pilasters flank the windows and entrance,
supporting a plain entablature above the
entrance.

1139-1141 6th St. People's Savings Bank Building. An example of the Prairie School bank style. It was constructed ca. 1905 of rust colored brick on the second floor and grayish brown brick on the lower level, with limestone trim. On the first floor the design of the multi-light display window opening remains relatively intact. The original entrance for the bank is between #1137 and #1141. It retains its original semicircular arched transom hidden behind the fixed canvas awning. A two-story brick addition to the bank was erected at the east end and contained offices. It had a separate entrance on L Avenue, which by that time was the paved route of the Lincoln Highway through Nevada.

WHEREAS, the Story County Sheriff's Department has submitted to the City of Nevada for its approval a proposed 28E Agreement concerning the matter, a copy of which is attached to the Resolution and marked Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein as if set out in full; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the City of Nevada and the citizens thereof to enter into the proposed 28E Agreement with the Story County Sheriff's Department.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Nevada, Story, County, Iowa, that the City of Nevada shall contract with the Story County Sheriff's Department for jail and dispatch services beginning July 1, 2020 and continuing through June 30, 2021 for the annual fee of \$41,535.78. The Mayor and City Administrator are hereby authorized to execute the agreement on behalf of the City.

28E of the Code of Iowa.		

The City of Nevada has no office wherein the police department may receive or dispatch telephone and radio messages on a 24 hour per day basis. Nevada agrees to the following terms with the Story County Sheriff's Office:

- 1. This contractual agreement shall commence on the first day of July, 2020 and shall continue for one (1) year ending on June 30, 2021. The per capita charge shall automatically increase by 4 percent or an amount equal to the U.S. Consumer Price Index for all Urban Consumers (CPI-U) for a 12 month period, to be reviewed each November and increased the lesser amount. The new rate will begin on the first day of each July.
- 2. Story County shall be reimbursed by Nevada for its dispatching services at a rate of \$6.11 per capita based on the 2010 census figure of 6,798; the annual fee is \$41,535.78. This fee shall be paid in equal quarterly installments to the Story County Sheriff's Office on July 1, October 1, January 1 and April 1.
- 3. The Sheriff of Story County and his deputies or duly designated representatives agree to receive in the Sheriff's Office or county jail, such telephone calls, teletype messages and radio messages as are directed to the Police Department and the Fire Department of the City of Nevada and transmit the same to the officers of the respective departments.

The Sheriff of Story County and his deputies or duly designated representatives agree to receive or dispatch telephone, radio and teletype messages on a 24 hour per day basis in the Sheriff's Office or county jail as are directed to the Nevada Wastewater Treatment Plant and transmit same to said department.

The Sheriff's Office telephone number shall be included on the Automatic Dialing Alarm System for the Water Department and Wastewater Treatment Plant.

- 4. The Sheriff's Designee will provide the Nevada Police Department with copies of teletype messages of general and specific interest to all law enforcement officers and agencies in Story County.
- 5. The Sheriff's Designee will provide a printed daily report to the Nevada Police Chief or the Chief's Designee of all phone calls received in the Dispatch Center and other such calls for service and activities that are entered into the Computer Aided Dispatch System for the Nevada Police Department.
- 6. The Sheriff agrees to provide and allow the Nevada Police Chief's Designee computer terminal access to the records contained in the Computer Aided Dispatch System that pertain to the activities of the Nevada Police Department and its officers.
- 7. The Story County Sheriff shall keep in the Story County Jail, under his control and supervision, any and all prisoners who have been committed to its care by the Chief of Police of the City of Nevada or his duly authorized agents or police officers, for violation of the city ordinances of Nevada, Iowa, at no additional charge.
- 8. The Sheriff and his deputies or duly designated representatives shall take fingerprints and forward same of all persons arrested and brought into custody at the Story County Jail by members of the Nevada Police Department to the Iowa Division of Criminal Investigation and the Federal Bureau of Investigation as required by State and Federal law.
- 9. The Sheriff agrees to allow the Nevada Police Chief or the Chief's Designee access to the criminal history and jail record files of all prisoners brought into custody at the Story County Jail by members of the Nevada Police Department.
- 10. The City of Nevada agrees to pay all medical and doctor expenses for injuries to or sickness of their prisoners held on City of Nevada ordinance violations and all other extraordinary expenses related to those prisoners which may occur and which are not due to the negligence of Story County or its employees.
- 11. Story County will furnish and maintain the necessary radio equipment to provide the services named above (The City of Nevada will pay for their telephone service on the designated police department line installed in the Sheriff's telephone system.)
- 12. In accordance with Section 28E.7 of the Code of Iowa, this agreement shall not relieve any of the parties hereto of any obligation or responsibility imposed upon it or them by law, except that to the extent of actual and timely performance thereof by either of the contracting parties hereto, said performance may be offered in satisfaction of the obligation or responsibility.
- 13. No separate legal or administrative entity or organization shall be created by this agreement; no separate budget shall be established and no tangible property shall

be acquired which would require disposition upon the termination of this agreement.

- 14. The duly elected Sheriff of Story County, Iowa, and the duly appointed City Administrator of Nevada, Iowa, shall be joint co-administrators of this agreement as provided by Section 28E.6(1) of the Code of Iowa.
- 15. As joint co-administrators the duly elected Sheriff of Story County, Iowa and the City Administrator, shall develop the necessary procedures to effectively administer this agreement including but not limited to addressing new situations not covered by this agreement and conflict resolution.
- 16. Story County shall file a copy of this agreement with the Secretary of State and the County Auditor of Story County, Iowa, and record a copy with the Story County Recorder pursuant to Section 28E.8 of the Code of Iowa. The city seal shall be affixed to the contract before returning to the county for filing.
- 17. This contract may be terminated by either party. Termination is effective at the end of the current quarterly billing cycle and must be preceded with a minimum 30 day written notice to either party. Notice shall be accomplished by certified mail or personal service.
- 18. Any amendments or addendums to this Agreement shall be created and passed in the same manner and with reference made to this original document.
- 19. The initial term of the Agreement shall be automatically extended for successive one-year periods upon the same terms and conditions provided by this Agreement for the initial term, unless this Agreement is terminated or modified by the express election of either City or County as hereinafter provided. Modification to this Agreement may be made by mutual consent of both parties.

The City Council of the City of Nevada, Iowa, will meet on March 23, 2020, at the Nevada City Hall Council Chambers, in the City, at 6:00 o'clock p.m., for the purpose of instituting proceedings and taking action to enter into a lease-purchase agreement (the "Lease-Purchase Agreement") with principal lease payments thereunder in a principal amount not to exceed \$52,000 for the purpose of acquiring a wide area mower and related equipment for municipal cemetery, parks and public works use.

MINUTES TO SET DATE FOR HEARING ON ENTERING INTO A LEASE-PURCHASE AGREEMENT

The City Council of the City of Nevada, Iowa, met on March 9, 2020, at 6:00 o'clock p.m., at the Nevada City Hall Council Chambers, in the City.

The Planning & Zoning Commission held a Public Hearing on March 2 to review proposed changes to the sizing of unattached accessory structures and recommended the changes below. The Council may schedule a public hearing for the March 23rd meeting to review.

Current Code

(2) Garage. The maximum size of a detached garage for single-family detached, single-family attached, or duplex residential uses shall not exceed 1,080 square feet and shall not have a dimension in excess of 40 feet on any one side, or 25% of the ground level square footage of the primary residential structure, whichever is larger.

(3) Total Area. All accessory buildings on a site, taken together, must comply with the building coverage requirements for the zoning district and shall not occupy more than 30% of any rear yard. This regulation shall not prohibit construction of a single garage with coverage up to 550 square feet on a minimum rear yard, even if such construction exceeds the 30% rear yard coverage restriction.

(4) No Variances. The Board of Adjustment shall not grant a variance enlarging an accessory building in the above districts.

Proposed Changes

(2) Garage Total Area. All accessory buildings on a site, taken together, must comply with the building coverage requirements for the zoning district and shall not occupy more than 30% of any rear yard. This regulation shall not prohibit construction of a single garage with coverage up to 576 square feet on a minimum rear yard, even if such construction exceeds the 30% rear yard coverage restriction.

Current Code

165.17 SUPPLEMENTAL SITE DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS.

- 1. Purpose. The Supplemental Site Development Regulations establish basic requirements for developable lots, including frontage requirements. These regulations recognize the existence of special conditions that cannot comply literally with the site development regulations set out for each zoning district. Therefore, these regulations qualify or modify the district regulations of this chapter and provide for specific areas of exception.
- 2. Required Street Frontage. Any lot used in whole or part for residential purposes shall provide a minimum frontage of 25 feet along at least one public street. There shall not be more than one single-family housing unit for such frontage. In order to satisfy this requirement, the frontage along a public street must permit direct access to such street.
- 3. Lot Size Exceptions. In any district permitting residential use types, a single-family or duplex use type may be located on any lot or plot of official record as of the effective date of this chapter, regardless of its area or width, but subject to the following requirements:
- A. The sum of the widths of the side yards of such lot shall be the lesser of those required by the district regulations or 25% of the width of the lot. No single side yard shall be less than 10% of the width of the lot.
- B. The depth of the rear yard of such lot need not exceed 20% of the depth of the lot, but shall not be less than 20 feet.
- C. If two or more such adjacent lots are combined under single ownership, the resulting combined lots shall be treated as a single lot for purposes of applying these setback requirements.
 - 4. Setback Adjustments.
- A. Lots Adjoining Alleys. In calculating the depth of a required side or rear yard setback for a lot adjoining a dedicated public alley, one-half of the alley may be credited as a portion of the yard. However, no residential structure may be nearer than five feet to the near side of the alley.
- B. Encroachments on Required Yards. Every part of a required yard shall be open and unobstructed from finished grade upward, except as specified herein.
- (1) Architectural projections, including roofs which cover porches, enclosed porches, window sills, belt courses, cornices, eaves, flues and chimneys and ornamental features may project three feet into a required yard.
- (2) Terraces, patios, uncovered decks, and ornamental features which have no structural element more than two feet above or below the adjacent ground level may project ten feet into a required yard. However, all such projections must be set back at least five feet from an adjacent side lot line; or fifteen (15) feet from any street property line.
- (3) Fire escapes, fireproof outside stairways, and balconies opening to fire towers may project a maximum of 3 feet into required yards, provided that they do not obstruct the light and ventilation of adjacent buildings.
- (4) For buildings constructed upon a front property line, a cornice may project into public right-of-way. Maximum projection is the smaller of four feet or five percent of the right-of-way width.
- (5) In commercial districts, a canopy may extend into a required front yard, provided that the canopy is set back at least five feet from the front property line, covers less than fifteen percent of the area of the required front yard, and has a vertical clearance of at least eight feet six inches.
- (6) Accessory buildings are subject to all site development regulations of its zoning district, except as provided below:

- a. Side Yards: An accessory building may be located a minimum of five feet from the side lot line of the property if it is located between the rear building line of the principal building and the rear property line.
- b. Front Yards: No accessory building may be located between the front building line of the principal building and the front property line.
- c. Rear Yard: The minimum rear yard setback for accessory buildings shall be 5 feet. This minimum rear yard setback shall be increased to 15 feet if the accessory building requires vehicular access from an alley. Double-frontage lots shall require front-yard setbacks along both street frontages as set forth in Table 165.09-3. Easements may be incorporated into these required setbacks. No accessory building shall be located within any easement or right-of-way along the rear property line.
- d. Street Yards: No accessory building shall be located within 25 feet from any street right-of-way line.
- e. Maximum Size of an Accessory Building in a R-1, R-2, R-3, R-4 or R-5 Residential District:
- (1) Shed. No accessory building other than a garage shall exceed 144 square feet, or 1.5% of total lot area, whichever is larger.
- (2) Garage. The maximum size of a detached garage for single-family detached, single-family attached, or duplex residential uses shall not exceed 1,080 square feet and shall not have a dimension in excess of 40 feet on any one side, or 25% of the ground level square footage of the primary residential structure, whichever is larger.
- (3) Total Area. All accessory buildings on a site, taken together, must comply with the building coverage requirements for the zoning district and shall not occupy more than 30% of any rear yard. This regulation shall not prohibit construction of a single garage with coverage up to 550 square feet on a minimum rear yard, even if such construction exceeds the 30% rear yard coverage restriction.
- (4) No Variances. The Board of Adjustment shall not grant a variance enlarging an accessory building in the above districts.
- (5) Building Permit. Construction of any accessory building requires the owner to obtain a building permit prior to commencing construction.
- f. Height: In residential districts, the maximum height shall be 16 feet for any accessory building. Maximum height for a detached garage and/or other accessory building in an AR District shall be 20 feet.
- g. Separation from Other Buildings: No accessory building shall be placed within ten feet of any other building on its own property or any adjacent properties.
- h. Attached Accessory Buildings: Any accessory building physically attached to the principal building shall be considered part of the principal building and subject to the development regulations of its zoning district.
- i. Effect on Adjacent Properties: If an adjacent lot is built upon, the accessory building must be entirely to the rear of the line of any principal building on such adjacent lot.
- j. Hazards: Any accessory use which creates a potential fire hazard shall be located a minimum of 10 feet from any residential structure. Such uses include but are not limited to detached fireplaces, barbecue ovens, or storage of flammable materials.
- k. No accessory building shall be built upon any lot until construction of the principal building has begun.

Good evening Council members,

I was a resident of Nevada for 8.5 years before I moved back to NW lowa. In 2012 I purchased a mobile home on the lake in Country Club Estates. I loved living there, I loved the town and I loved working at the elementary school. In February 2019, the opportunity to move 'back home' to be closer to my kids became available so I put my home up for sale and moved. I would come back about once a month to check on things and stay in my mobile home, so I kept all utilities on. For the last twelve months that I have been gone, I have paid the monthly water/sewer bill, even though I was only there about one weekend per month and didn't use anywhere near 1000 gallons of water.


My realtor, Marc Olson, said he checked on the mobile home once a week. On January 26th, 2020 I got a panicked phone call from him saying that there was water gushing out of a broken valve/pipe under the kitchen sink. I told him where the shut off was and he was able to get it turned off. The water damage was so extensive, that to fix it would cost more than what I had it insured for, so the insurance company 'totaled' it. I am just sick about this damage and the consequent loss.

When I called to see how much my water bill was, she said that they hadn't read the meter yet. Since then, I have received that bill and it is \$1210.98 after my deposit was deducted. This is going to be a huge challenge for me to pay off in a timely manner. I understand that there are expenses that the city incurs with the water treatment and I would not ask you to forgive the whole bill, but I'd like to ask you if you would concede to waiving the sewer bill and the water excise tax. Since the leak was under the sink, none of the water went down a drain. All of that water soaked into the carpets, other flooring, up into the walls and is possibly still frozen in the under-belly wrap.

I appreciate your consideration on this matter and look forward to hearing from you soon.



A final reading was done on 1-31-2020 after Kevin of Flummerfelt contacted the city informing us they had shut off the service to this vacant property.

The reading was 1372. This is 111,900 gallons more than the Jan 2020 cycle reading. I asked the Water Dept to verify the reading. They did and got a data-download meter information. The reading is accurate.

During a later conversation with I informed Kevin of the huge final bill. He said he had suggested the owner of the home to shut off the service and get it winterized. They said they occasionally come back and stay for a short time. At no time did Kevin indicate of any kind of leak or cause of the high usage. He did not seem surprised there was going to be a high bill.

At some point during the conversation with Kevin either Balinda or I were informed the insurance company "denied" the damage claim.

On March 3, 2020 Kevin of Flummerfelt Properties called and spoke to me. He confirmed the extensive water damage started in the kitchen and spread throughout the home. There is no floor drain for the water to go. He also said the insurance company totaled the home. Flummerfelt Homes were going to try to rebuild or repair the damages. Kevin said since to customer was out of town, he intended to be present during the council meeting that would address the issue. However, he will not be able to make this Monday's (March 9, 2020) meeting. If needed, photos of the damages could be taken and made available.

Interim City Administrator's Report as of March 9th, 2020

- Wage and Salary Study: On Monday, 2/24/2020, before the City Council Meeting, the Wage and Salary Study Committee met. This included Mayor Brett Barker, Council members Sandy Ehrig and Jason Sampson, City Clerk Kerin Wright and me. Documents were reviewed and discussed. Next step is putting an RFP together.
- **Betterment Committee Meeting:** On Monday, 2/24/2020, after the City Council Meeting, a meeting of the Betterment Committee took place. A presentation from the University of Iowa Iowa Initiative for Sustainable Communities took place. The discussion primarily talked about ideas and actions to promote Nevada.
- Meeting with Burke, Chad Randick: On Tuesday, 2/25/2020, at about 10:00am, Mayor Barker and I met with the President of Burke. The 210 employees, including the 52 High Quality jobs, and the tax valuation are still in discussion. We will be continuing our efforts.
- Budget Committee Meeting: On Tuesday, 2/25/2020, the Budget Committee met at about 3:00pm. This included Council Members Brian Hansen and Luke Spence, CC Kerin Wright, and I. With information provided by Michael Maloney of DA Davidson, potential rate increase were discussed regarding sewer and water rates. More information and another meeting to take place.
- **NEDC Meeting:** On Wednesday, 2/26/2020, at 7:00am the NEDC Meeting took place. Included in the discussions was the resolution of the Riesselmen Land Acquisition, NEDC Office space at City Hall, status of the Burke Agreement, and some discussion on the Fiber Conduit project.
- Meeting with Alliant: After the NEDC Meeting I spoke with Mason Adams, Account Representative with Alliant Energy. Mason stated Alliant Energy would like to use an easement to connect a back-up power line from the Alliant Energy Substation on 19th St, west through SCORE Park, then south on 11th St. The project, if all goes well, would be in the September time period. After the meeting I discussed this with Shawn Cole and Tim Hansen.
- WWTF Improvements 30% Design Review: On Tuesday, February 26th, at about 5:30pm a meeting took place at HRGreen in Johnston, Ia. The discussion focused on the proposed design and plans for the Waste Water Treatment Facility. Present for the City of Nevada were Mayor Brett Barker, Council Members Barb Mittman and Jason Sampson, Public Works Director Jeremy Rydl, Waste Water Treatment Superintendent Mike Neal, City Clerk Kerin Wright, and myself. The presentation was scheduled to conclude at 7:00pm but continued until 8:00. While much was discussed, HRGreen would be sending out a questionnaire to each present to get their input.

Fiber Conduit Exploration: Mayor Brett Barker received an email from Joe Salerno, a representative of MetroNet. MetroNet provides fiber IPTV, Internet, and phone service. MetroNet is in the process of a fiber buildout in Ames. Joe requested a meeting to discuss the possibility of providing this same service to Nevada. A meeting was set up for Friday, 2/28/2020, at 9:00am.

At the meeting was Mayor Barker, City Clerk Kerin Wright, P&Z Shawn Cole, NEDC John Hall, and I. Joe Salerno was present with two (2) other MetroNet personnel. Discussions went well. MetroNet will provide more information on their plans for the community to be reviewed by the Mayor and staff.

City Department Head Meeting: On Monday, 3/2/2020, at 9:00am, the bi-weekly staff meeting took place at the Nevada Public Library. The previously mentioned meetings were discussed and staff updated. Also discussed was the status of the search for a new City Administrator.

TANKER 410

The tanker we converted from a federal surplus vehicle is fully in service. The final bill for the vehicle was \$11,991.91. The four rural townships have graciously provided \$4,000 from their funds to help cover some of the final costs of this vehicle. We will be looking to a budget amendment for the remainder of the balance (\$7,991.91) to pay this final invoice. The invoice is for cab painting, the tool box, and other ancillary costs beyond the cost of the box retrofit. This additional cost was not budgeted due to the length of time it took to complete the project between two budget years. There are available funds in the capital account but they were not marked for this vehicle project.

ENGINE 310

We are starting to see some issues with engine 310. The vehicle is a 1997 Spartan engine holding 1000 gallons of water. The vehicle is 23 years old. We have currently replaced three valves in the engine and will be replacing 3 more. We are experiencing some major leaks in the valves causing the vehicle to



empty frequently. That is an operational risk we cannot accept. The replacement of valves seems to be a good fix. The vehicle had a new shore line charger motor replaced last year. The charger when plugged into the shore line at the station keeps the air brakes supply cylinders filled and charges our portable radios. Our capital is not at a level we could replace this vehicle. At some point we would like to consider downsizing our fleet and have an engine tanker combination replacing 510 and 310 at the same time.

Much of our maintenance is completed by two of our members. This has reduced our vehicle repair costs. Most of our smaller items can get fixed before turning into more costly items.

SCHOOL FIRE SAFETY TURN OUT GEAR

The Nevada Jaycees have purchased a set of children's turnout gear for our department. This gear will allow our firefighters to interact with the students while keeping kids from being exposed to the harmful toxins firefighters carry on their own turnout gear. Research is showing despite regular gear washing, some chemical toxins of a fire remain on the gear providing a risk of getting various cancers. This gear helps us demonstrate our gear without exposing the kids to harm.

Library Director Shanna Speer reported on:



Overview of Municipal Securities Disclosure

Governmental issuers ("Issuers") of municipal bonds are subject to several important legal provisions under federal securities laws. This overview serves as a starting point for understanding the federal securities law framework surrounding issuance of municipal bonds. In recent years, the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC") has expanded its regulation of the municipal securities market, bringing civil and criminal enforcement actions against issuers, elected officials, and employees for violations of the anti-fraud or continuing disclosure provisions described below.

This overview should be reviewed in connection with the Issuer's policies and procedures (the "Disclosure Policy"), which relate to (1) the disclosure document (often referred to as the "official statement" or "OS") for publicly-offered bond transactions and (2) ongoing continuing disclosure associated with outstanding bond issues (also known as "continuing disclosure").

Overview of Legal Duties Under Federal Securities Law

Issuers of municipal securities are regulated by the Securities Act of 1933 and the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and various rules promulgated under those acts by the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC"). Of particular importance are Rule 10b-5 (which prohibits fraud) and Rule 15c2-12 (which generates an issuer's ongoing disclosure obligations). Taken together, these rules impose primary disclosure duties (i.e. accuracy and forthrightness in the preparation of an official statement for new bond issues) and secondary disclosure duties (i.e. timely filing financial and other data under a continuing disclosure certificate ("CDC") for outstanding bond issues).

How Do the Anti-Fraud Provisions of SEC Rule 10b-5 Affect Issuers?

Various provisions of federal securities law including SEC Rule 10b-5 prohibit fraud in the issuance, purchase, or sale of municipal securities. These provisions generally prohibit "material" misstatements or omissions to investors, potential investors, or the general public. Violation of these provisions can result in civil or criminal liability.

Who Is Responsible for the Content of an OS?

When bonds are issued and publicly offered, an official statement will be prepared on behalf of the Issuer. The official statement is the disclosure document that sets forth the terms associated with the bond issue and is used to market and sell the Issuer's bonds. Issuers (including elected officials and staff) are primarily responsible for the accuracy of an official statement. Hiring a professional to assist with the preparation of an OS does not discharge an Issuer's responsibility. The elected officials and relevant employees of an issuer have an affirmative obligation to ensure the accuracy of the contents of the financial and other information in an OS— delivery of an OS without first reading it to gauge its accuracy may be reckless and the basis for an SEC enforcement action.

What Ongoing Requirements Are Imposed by SEC Rule 15c2-12?

SEC Rule 15c2-12 ensures that Issuers contractually agree to provide certain financial and operating information to investors and the public on an ongoing basis. The type of information that must be reported is generally (i) annual financial reports and (ii) material event notices.



What Are the Annual Filing Requirements?

Issuers must file updated financial information and operating data on an annual or other regular basis, as specified in their CDC. Generally, the information that must be reported includes audited financial statements, annual financial or operating data, of the type included in the OS for the related bonds.

What Material Event Notices Must Be Filed and When?

Issuers must notify investors (via a specific filing on the "EMMA" website, at https://emma.msrb.org/) within 10 business days if certain events occur while a bond is outstanding. Generally, those events are items that impact an Issuer's ability to pay or timely pay amounts owed on outstanding debt, rating changes, defaults, and the incurrence of material financial obligations (debt obligations of the Issuer). At present, there are 16 events that can trigger reporting obligations. The Issuer's Disclosure Policy will detail the events and the procedures intended to enable timely identification and disclosure.

What is Addressed by the Disclosure Policy?

The Disclosure Policy is designed to assist Issuers with fulfilling both primary and secondary disclosure responsibilities. It sets forth procedures that govern preparation of official statements for new bond offerings (see Appendix I of the policy), compliance with continuing disclosure requirements under a CDC (see Appendix II of the policy), and systematic training of key staff members and elected officials.

Where Can I Find Additional Information?

As always, you and your staff can contact us with any questions about your responsibilities under federal securities law, to address specific items, and for annual training seminars (Dorsey & Whitney LLP provides an annual securities law training for issuers during the first quarter of each year, to satisfy one of the requirements of the Disclosure Policy).

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
