Another requirement is that the local Main Street Committee have an annual operating budget of \$60,000 per year for a minimum 3-year commitment. Representatives of the local Main Street Nevada Committee will be in attendance to answer any questions from the council. If the desire of the council is to become a Main Street Iowa Community, it will require the participation and financial support of the Main Street Nevada program with a 3-year commitment. With the display of community support in becoming a Main Street Iowa Community, it is the recommendation of City Administrator Mardesen to approve Resolution No. 068 (2018/2019); authorizing participation in Main Street Iowa Program and designating a City Official for the Board of Directors.

B. Resolution No. 069 (2018/2019): A Resolution in Support of Story County Housing Trust

Enclosed you shall find the Resolution No. 069 (2018/2019): Support of the Story County Housing Trust. Brenda Dryer with the Ames Chamber of Commerce & Economic Development will be in attendance to present an overview of the SCHT. Also enclosed are the supporting documentation provided by Brenda for your review. The City of Nevada previously supported the SCHT in FY 2017/2018 in the amount of \$4,580.33. The City of Nevada has excess funds available in the Low/Moderate-Income Housing from the TIF requirements from the Indian Ridge Sub-division. With the limited uses of the LMI funds, the SCHT is a qualifying use of these funds. Therefore, it is the recommendation of City Administrator Mardesen to approve Resolution No. 069 (2018/2019); supporting the Story County Housing Trust in the amount of \$3,666.43.

City Administrator's Report as of June 5, 2019

- **Department Head Meeting:** Department Head meeting was held on Monday, June 3rd at City Hall. Enclosed is a copy of the staff agenda in the council packet.
- Nevada's New Waste Water Treatment Facility Overview: On May 31st, I met with Mike Roth with HR Green to sign some of the documents for the submittal of the preliminary plan of the new WWTF to the Iowa Department of Natural Resources. In addition, we discussed the requirements to initially request future funding from the Iowa State Revolving Fund in 2021-2023, which is part of the DNR process. HR Green will continue to work on the plans, as we wait for approval from the Iowa DNR.
- Main Street Iowa Committee Meeting: On Saturday, June 1st, several members of the Nevada Main Street Committee met to work on the Main Street Nevada application. This was a good opportunity to gauge how much of the application has been completed. We spent about 3 hours on the application and are confident we will be able to complete the application prior to the deadline. There is a great deal of work to get completed, but the support continues to be positive and present when needed.
- Council Strategic Planning Session preparation: I wanted to thank the council and all of the department heads for their participation in the planning session at the Story County Medical Center. I believe it was beneficial for everyone to see the ideas that were brought forward and the formation of the common ground we have. I thought Brenda Dryer did a nice job facilitating the process and I look forward to reviewing the draft.
- Nevada Central Business District Steering Committee Meeting: On June 4th, the CBD Steering Committee meet to discuss multiple issues that will guide the next phase of planning for the downtown project. One of the issues discussed is the bump outs in the roadway and the concerns regarding the longevity of pavers in the street scape. We have several issues to consider and research as we continue to work on the plans. The General Public Meeting is scheduled for June 18, 2019 at 6:00 pm in the council chambers.

- Special 45 MPH Speed Zones
 On Nineteenth (19th) Street from South G Avenue to Union Pacific Railroad (Repeal this paragraph)

SECTION 2. SECTION MODIFIED. Chapter 65 (Stop or Yield Required), Section 65.01 (Stops Required by Vehicles Entering Stop Intersection) is hereby amended by adding under Subsection 28, (On Nineteenth (19th) Street), paragraph C and D (28.C and 28.D) and amending Sub-section 32 (On South B Avenue), paragraph B (32.B) and adopting the following in lieu thereof:

- 28. On Nineteenth (19th) Street
 - C. South Bound at Intersection of South B Avenue 4-way stop
 - D. North Bound at intersection of South B Avenue 4 way stop
- On South B Avenue
 - B. East bound at intersection of South Nineteenth (19th) Street 4-way stop

SECTION 3. REPEALER. All ordinances or parts or ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.







RESOLUTION REQUESTING SUPPORT OF STORY COUNTY HOUSING TRUST

WHEREAS, the Story County Housing Trust (SCHT) is a 403b nonprofit entity and also certified as a Local Housing Trust Fund (LHTF) with the State of Iowa in accordance with Administrative Rules, and is administered through the State Housing Trust Fund (SHTF) managed by the Iowa Finance Authority; and

WHEREAS, Story County is one of most recent counties in the state of lowa that has formed a LHTF. In doing so, the SCHT has accessed a substantial pool of monies to use towards attaining and maintaining affordable housings; and

WHEREAS, the SHTF determines how the funding will be distributed to the State's 26 LHTFs; and determines accountability standards; and in order to abide by all of the standards the Board of Directors of the SCHT has contracted with the Polk County Housing Trust Fund (PCHTF) to provide administrative services through 2019; and

WHEREAS, to date, the SCHT has received two grants from the SHTF and matching monies were obtained for these grants. The Board of Directors are now charged with the task of fund raising to ensure future monies are available to make applications to the SHTF monies on or around October 1, 2019 (for FY2019 & FY2020) for continuing services in Story County; the current Board members are Steve Ringlee, Erik Bunker, Amber Corrieri, Board Chair, Brenda Dryer, Shelley Jaspering, Marty Chitty, Marc Olson, Hope Metheny, Greg Schlueter, Sheryl Phipps, Lauris Olson and Craig D. Henry, and

WHEREAS, the SCHT continues to actively work with Story County and the municipalities within Story County to identify their specific needs. The areas of need, thus far, have included rental assistance and rehabilitation of existing housing stock, in FY2018 whereas, the Board allocated \$184,849.00 to six (6) agencies/municipalities/faith based organizations to provide Owner-Occupied Repairs to residents with 80% AMI and allocated \$114,313.00 towards Rental Assistance; FY2019 allocations are: \$185,000.00 for OOR programs and \$64,467.00 towards Rental Assistance; and

This program will target homeowners with incomes at or below 50% Area Median Income (AMI), with priority given to those \leq 30% AMI. These funds are designed to help homeowners with repairs to their homes that they otherwise cannot afford.

Grant funds may be used for but not limited to:

- Extraordinary Repairs: Repair of one or more of the major building systems: electrical, mechanical, plumbing and structural (including but not limited to roof, girders, foundation)

- Deferred Repairs: Repairs that have been delayed addressing other priority concerns

SCHT is funded through a collaboration of public and private donors. - Deposits for rent and/or utilities. (Landlords would pay rent deposit back to grantee not the tenant(s).

Grant funds may NOT be used for:

- Ongoing rent
- Student housing

SCHT is funded through a collaboration of public and private donors. Their donations were instrumental in receiving a State Housing Trust Fund Grant from the Iowa

Finance Authority, as 25% of the SHTF monies must be matched by local dollars. Those dollars are being dispersed to repair and rehab Story County residents' homes.





City Administrator's Report as of June 5, 2019

- **Department Head Meeting:** Department Head meeting was held on Monday, June 3rd at City Hall. Enclosed is a copy of the staff agenda in the council packet.
- Nevada's New Waste Water Treatment Facility Overview: On May 31st, I met with Mike Roth with HR Green to sign some of the documents for the submittal of the preliminary plan of the new WWTF to the Iowa Department of Natural Resources. In addition, we discussed the requirements to initially request future funding from the Iowa State Revolving Fund in 2021-2023, which is part of the DNR process. HR Green will continue to work on the plans, as we wait for approval from the Iowa DNR.
- Main Street Iowa Committee Meeting: On Saturday, June 1st, several members of the Nevada Main Street Committee met to work on the Main Street Nevada application. This was a good opportunity to gauge how much of the application has been completed. Joint Agency Traffic Project

The following statement was put out by Sgt. Josh Cizmadia on behalf of the traffic project conducted last week. It is on the NPD Facebook:

"On Friday, May 31, 2019 the Nevada Public Safety Department conducted a Joint Agency Traffic Project with the Story County Sheriff's Office and Iowa State Patrol. For a 6 hour period we had 76 traffic contacts, issued 38 citations, 75 warnings, 2 motorists assist, 2 vehicle searches for drugs and 2 subjects were arrested for non-traffic related incidents. This was a successful project and we were able to educate drivers in the safety of not speeding, texting and driving and wearing a seat belt. We will continue to reach our goal of zero fatalities on Iowa roads and especially in Story County. We will be conducting more projects like this throughout the summer so you and your family can feel safe on Iowa roads!"

Ultra-High Pressure Firefighting


Several of our firefighters recently attended the Bondurant training summit utilizing Ultra-High Pressure fire streams. Attack truck 610 has a 200 gallon UHP skid unit replacing the 15 year old overweight unit previously used. The unit has proven valuable on rural grass fires and wildland fires. We are seeing this unit put out 75% more fire before needing to re-fill compared to the other traditional skid unit (710) with a 300 gallon capacity. There were eight other departments with UHP units in attendance and departments were able to use their own units putting out 25 car fires. This gave our staff plenty of nozzle time to develop confidence in deploying UHP.

The extinguishment times were as follows:

25 car burns = extinguished in 15-20 seconds per vehicle = used 10 gallons of water on average to put out the fire in every scenario. As you can see from the picture, this was not a small vehicle fire. Many vehicles we let burn for 12 minutes to indicate a long simulated response time.

The six room fully engulfed house fire was controlled with one hand line in 63 seconds using just over 20 gallons of water. Remarkable!

On June 3, I authorized those trained on our department to use UHP for car fires. Previously we used UHP only on grass fires. Our experiences are expanding its use and application on fire scenes.




Fireworks

There have been three applications to sell fireworks in the NFD fire district to date. Bellino will be selling in the Fareway lot, Dollar General will have inside sales in the store, and a fireworks vendor will be set up again off of Sand Hill Trail on Highway 30 by the Ames city limits. The City of Nevada will be conducting fireworks safety inspections of all sites. We have left over safety flyers from last year for the vendors to provide to their customers.

Realistic Fire Training

The fire department has set a priority in 2019 to step up our training programs in order to assure our firefighters are ready for the call. The association recently purchased two 40 feet semi conex containers. With the help from the city and several local companies those containers are now in use. This type of realistic training allows our firefighters to extinguish real fires feeling the sensory effects of working around live fires.

The pictures below illustrate the difference between a wood pallet fire and the addition of a small 8 inch X 11 inch piece of blue-board foam. It allows our firefighters to learn about normal fire growth and how manufactured products found in homes can affect visibility, heat, and toxicity of the fire. Many other departments without these type of facilities pretend to deploy hose streams on traffic cones to simulate fire. This has been very well received by our staff.
