Notice Is Hereby Given: That at 6:00 o'clock p.m., at the Nevada City Council Chambers, Nevada, lowa, on September 14, 2020, the City Council of the City of Nevada will hold a public hearing on the question of amending the plan for the Nevada Urban Renewal Area (the "Urban Renewal Area") and designating an expanded Nevada Urban Renewal Area, pursuant to Chapter 403, Code of Iowa, by adding and including all the property described as follows:

The Northeast Quarter of the Southeast Quarter, except the East 60.00 feet thereof, in Section 18, Township 83 North, Range 22 West of the 5th P.M. Story County,

The proposed amendment to the urban renewal plan brings the property described above under the plan and makes it subject to the provisions of the plan. The amendment also facilitates the undertaking of new urban renewal projects in the Urban Renewal Area, consisting of (a) providing tax increment financing support to South Glen, LLC in connection with the construction of public infrastructure necessary for the development of a residential subdivision; (b) providing tax incre-ment financing support to Mid-States Material Handling & Fabrication, Inc. (the "Company") in connection with the expansion of the Company's existing manufac-turing facilities; and (c) providing tax increment financing support to On Track Construction, LLC in connection with the construction of public infrastructure necessary for the development of an industrial park.

RESOLUTION NO. 021 (2020/2021)

Resolution to Declare Necessity and Establish an Urban Renewal Area, Pursuant to Section 403.4 of the Code of Iowa and to Approve an Urban Renewal Plan Amendment for the Nevada Urban Renewal Area

WHEREAS, as a preliminary step to exercising the authority conferred upon Iowa cities by Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa (the "Urban Renewal Law"), a municipality must adopt a resolution finding that one or more slums, blighted or economic development areas exist in the municipality and that the development of such area or areas is necessary in the interest of the public health, safety or welfare of the residents of the municipality; and

WHEREAS, the City Council (the "Council") of the City of Nevada (the "City") has previously created the Nevada Urban Renewal Area (the "Urban Renewal Area") and adopted an urban renewal plan (the "Plan") for the governance of projects and initiatives therein; and

WHEREAS, a proposal has been made which shows the desirability of expanding the Urban Renewal Area to add and include all the property (the "Property") lying within the legal description set out in Exhibit A hereto; and

WHEREAS, the proposal demonstrates that sufficient need exists to warrant finding the Property to be an economic development area; and

WHEREAS, an amendment (the "Amendment") to the Plan has been prepared which (1) covers the addition of the Property to the Urban Renewal Area; and (2) facilitates the undertaking of new urban renewal projects in the Urban Renewal Area, consisting of (a) providing tax increment financing support to South Glen, LLC in connection with the construction of public infrastructure necessary for the development of a residential subdivision; (b) providing tax increment financing support to Mid-States Material Handling & Fabrication, Inc. (the "Company") in connection with the expansion of the Company's existing manufacturing facilities (the "MMF Expansion Project"); and (c) providing tax increment financing support to On Track Construction, LLC in connection with the construction of public infrastructure necessary for the development of an industrial park; and

WHEREAS, notice of a public hearing by the City Council of the City on the question of establishing the Property as an urban renewal area and on the proposed Amendment for the Urban Renewal Area was heretofore given in strict compliance with the provisions of Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa, and the Council has conducted said hearing on September 14, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City has reviewed and commented on the proposed Amendment; and

WHEREAS, copies of the urban renewal plan amendment, notice of public hearing and notice of a consultation meeting with respect to the Amendment were mailed to Story County and the Nevada Community School District; the consultation meeting was held on the 27th day of

August, 2020; and responses to any comments or recommendations received following the consultation meeting were made as required by law;

- NOW, THEREFORE, It Is Resolved by the City Council of the City of Nevada, Iowa, as follows:
- Section 1. An economic development area as defined in Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa, is found to exist in the City of Nevada on the Property.
- Section 2. The Property is hereby declared to be an urban renewal area, in conformance with the requirements of Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa, and is hereby designated the September, 2020 Addition to the Nevada Urban Renewal Area.
- Section 3. The development of the Property is necessary in the interest of the public health, safety or welfare of the residents of the City.
 - Section 4. It is hereby determined by this City Council as follows:
 - A. The proposed Amendment and the projects and initiatives described therein conform to the general plan of the municipality as a whole;
 - B. The proposed economic development projects described in the Amendment are necessary and appropriate to facilitate the proper growth and development of the City in accordance with sound planning standards and local community objectives.
 - C. It is not anticipated that relocation of families will be an issue in connection with the projects and programs described in the Amendment. To the extent that relocation is necessary, provision will be made to assist any impacted families.
- Section 5. The Amendment attached hereto and made a part hereof, is hereby in all respects approved.
- Section 6. All resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed, to the extent of such conflict.

URBAN RENEWAL PLAN AMENDMENT NEVADA URBAN RENEWAL AREA

September, 2020

The Urban Renewal Plan (the "Plan") for the Nevada Urban Renewal Area (the "Urban Renewal Area") in the City of Nevada, Iowa (the "City") is being amended for the purposes of adding certain property to the Urban Renewal Area and identifying new urban renewal projects to be undertaken within the Urban Renewal Area.

- 1) Addition of Property. The real property (the "Property") legally described on Exhibit A hereto is, by virtue of this Amendment, being added as the September, 2020 Addition to the Urban Renewal Area. With the adoption of this Amendment, the City will designate the Property as an economic development area. The Property will become subject to the provisions of the Plan for the Urban Renewal Area. It is anticipated that the City will adopt an ordinance providing for the division of property tax revenues, as set forth in Section 403.19 of the Code of Iowa, with respect to the Property.
- 2) Identification of Projects. By virtue of this amendment, the list of authorized urban renewal projects in the Plan is hereby amended to include the following project descriptions:

A.

Name of Project: South Glen, LLC Residential Subdivision Development Project

Name of Urban Renewal Area: Nevada Urban Renewal Area

Date of Council Approval of Project: September 14, 2020

Description of Project and Project Site: South Glen, LLC (the "Developer") is undertaking the development of a residential subdivision situated on the Property (as defined in Section 1 above), including the corresponding construction of public infrastructure (the "Infrastructure Project"). The City will use tax increment financing to support the Developer's construction of the Infrastructure Project on the Property. The addition of new residential housing in the City will enhance the quality of life in the City thereby resulting in commercial and residential growth in the City.

The costs incurred by the City in providing tax increment financing assistance to the Developer will include legal and administrative fees (the "Admin Fees") in an amount not to exceed \$8,000.

Description of Use of TIF: The City intends to enter into a development agreement (the "Agreement") with the Developer with respect to the Infrastructure Project and to provide annual appropriation economic development payments (the "Payments") to the Developer thereunder. The Payments, in an amount not to exceed \$1,500,000, will be funded with

incremental property tax revenues to be derived from the Property. It is anticipated that the City's total commitment of incremental property tax revenues with respect to the Infrastructure Project including the Payments, the Admin Fees and the LMI Set Aside (as described below) will not exceed \$2,204,708.

LMI Set Aside: Pursuant to the provisions of Section 403.22 of the Code of Iowa, the City will provide low and moderate income family housing assistance in its area of operation in an amount not less than 46.98% of the incremental property tax revenues applied to the Infrastructure Project.

Description of Project and Project Site: Mid-States Material Handling & Fabrication, Inc. (the "Company") has proposed to undertake the expansion of the Company's existing manufacturing facilities and operations (the "Project") situated at 1280 South B Avenue (the "Development Property") in the Urban Renewal Area.

It has been requested that the City provide tax increment financing assistance to the Company in support of the efforts to complete and implement the Project.

The costs incurred by the City in providing tax increment financing assistance to the Company will include legal and administrative fees (the "Admin Fees") in an amount not to exceed \$7,000.

Description of Public Infrastructure Projects: It is not anticipated that the City will install public infrastructure in connection with the Project.

Description of Properties to be Acquired in Connection with Project: It is not anticipated that the City will acquire real property in connection with the Project.

Description of Use of TIF: The City intends to enter into a development agreement with the Company with respect to the development and construction of the completed Project and to provide annual appropriation economic development payments (the "Payments") thereunder. The Payments will be funded with incremental property tax revenues to be derived from the Development Property. It is anticipated that the City's total commitment of incremental property tax revenues with respect to the Project will not exceed \$225,000, plus the Admin Fees.

It has been requested that the City provide tax increment financing assistance to the Developer in support of the efforts to complete the Industrial Park Infrastructure Project.

Description of Use of TIF for the Project: The City intends to enter into a Development Agreement with the Developer with respect to the construction of the Industrial Park Infrastructure Project and to provide annual appropriation economic development payments (the "Payments") to the Developer thereunder. The Payments will be funded with incremental property tax revenues to be derived from the Industrial Park Property. It is anticipated that the City's total commitment of incremental property tax revenues with respect to the Industrial Park Infrastructure Project will not exceed \$1,500,000, plus the Admin Fees.

ORDINANCE NO. 1013 (2020/2021)

An Ordinance Providing for the Division of Taxes Levied on Taxable Property in the September, 2020 Addition to the Nevada Urban Renewal Area, Pursuant to Section 403.19 of the Code of Iowa

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Nevada, Iowa (the "City") previously enacted an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Providing For The Division Of Taxes Levied On Taxable Property In The Nevada Urban Renewal Area, Pursuant to Section 403.19 of the Code of Iowa"; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to that ordinance, certain taxable property within the Nevada Urban Renewal Area in the City was designated a "tax increment district"; and

WHEREAS, the City Council now desires to establish a new "tax increment district" by designating the real property comprising the September, 2020 Addition to the Nevada Urban Renewal Area;

BE IT ENACTED by the Council of the City of Nevada, Iowa:

Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this ordinance is to provide for the division of taxes levied on the taxable property in the September, 2020 Addition to the Nevada Urban Renewal Area of the City of Nevada, Iowa, each year by and for the benefit of the state, city, county, school districts or other taxing districts after the effective date of this ordinance in order to create a special fund to pay the principal of and interest on loans, moneys advanced to or indebtedness, including bonds proposed to be issued by the City of Nevada to finance projects in such area.

Section 2. Definitions. For use within the remainder of this ordinance the following terms shall have the following meanings:

"City" shall mean the City of Nevada, Iowa.

"County" shall mean Story County, Iowa.

"Urban Renewal Area Addition" shall mean the September, 2020 Addition to the Nevada Urban Renewal Area of the City of Nevada, Iowa, the legal description of which is set out below, approved by the City Council by resolution adopted on September 14, 2020:

The Northeast Quarter of the Southeast Quarter, except the East 60.00 feet thereof, in Section 18, Township 83 North, Range 22 West of the 5th P.M. Story County, Iowa.

"Urban Renewal Area" shall mean the entirety of the Nevada Urban Renewal Area as amended from time to time.

Section 3. Provisions for Division of Taxes Levied on Taxable Property in the Urban Renewal Area Addition. After the effective date of this ordinance, the taxes levied on the taxable property in the Urban Renewal Area Addition each year by and for the benefit of the State of Iowa,

the City, the County and any school district or other taxing district in which the Urban Renewal Area Addition is located, shall be divided as follows:

- (a) that portion of the taxes which would be produced by the rate at which the tax is levied each year by or for each of the taxing districts upon the total sum of the assessed value of the taxable property in the Urban Renewal Area Addition, as shown on the assessment roll as of January 1 of the calendar year preceding the first calendar year in which the City certifies to the County Auditor the amount of loans, advances, indebtedness, or bonds payable from the special fund referred to in paragraph (b) below, shall be allocated to and when collected be paid into the fund for the respective taxing district as taxes by or for said taxing district into which all other property taxes are paid. For the purpose of allocating taxes levied by or for any taxing district which did not include the territory in the Urban Renewal Area Addition on the effective date of this ordinance, but to which the territory has been annexed or otherwise included after the effective date, the assessment roll applicable to property in the annexed territory as of January 1 of the calendar year preceding the effective date of the ordinance which amends the plan for the Urban Renewal Area Addition to include the annexed area, shall be used in determining the assessed valuation of the taxable property in the annexed area.
- that portion of the taxes each year in excess of such amounts shall be allocated to and when collected be paid into a special fund of the City to pay the principal of and interest on loans, moneys advanced to or indebtedness, whether funded, refunded, assumed or otherwise, including bonds issued under the authority of Section 403.9(1), of the Code of Iowa, incurred by the City to finance or refinance, in whole or in part, projects in the Urban Renewal Area, and to provide assistance for low and moderate-income family housing as provided in Section 403.22, except that taxes for the regular and voter-approved physical plant and equipment levy of a school district imposed pursuant to Section 298.2 of the Code of Iowa, taxes for the instructional support program levy of a school district imposed pursuant to Section 257.19 of the Code of Iowa and taxes for the payment of bonds and interest of each taxing district shall be collected against all taxable property within the taxing district without limitation by the provisions of this ordinance. Unless and until the total assessed valuation of the taxable property in the Urban Renewal Area Addition exceeds the total assessed value of the taxable property in such area as shown by the assessment roll referred to in subsection (a) of this section, all of the taxes levied and collected upon the taxable property in the Urban Renewal Area Addition shall be paid into the funds for the respective taxing districts as taxes by or for said taxing districts in the same manner as all other property taxes. When such loans, advances, indebtedness, and bonds, if any, and interest thereon, have been paid, all money thereafter received from taxes upon the taxable property in the Urban Renewal Area Addition shall be paid into the funds for the respective taxing districts in the same manner as taxes on all other property.
- (c) the portion of taxes mentioned in subsection (b) of this section and the special fund into which that portion shall be paid may be irrevocably pledged by the City for the payment of the principal and interest on loans, advances, bonds issued under the authority of Section 403.9(1) of the Code of Iowa, or indebtedness incurred by the City to finance or refinance in whole or in part projects in the Urban Renewal Area.
- (d) as used in this section, the word "taxes" includes, but is not limited to, all levies on an ad valorem basis upon land or real property.

- Section 4. Repealer. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.
- Section 5. Saving Clause. If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.
- Section 6. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be effective after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

This agreement, effective as of the later of the dates of signature below ("Effective Date"), is between **City of Nevada** ("Company"), and The SpyGlass Group, LLC, an Ohio limited liability company ("Auditor").

1. **Primary Audit Services**. Company is engaging Auditor as an independent contractor to analyze its primary telecommunications service accounts (Voice, Data, Internet, Cloud Services and Mobility/Cellular) to seek cost recovery, service elimination and cost reduction recommendations. Company will provide Auditor with the materials required to perform its analysis and Auditor will conduct a Kickoff meeting with Company to review the materials provided and introduce Auditor's personnel assigned to the project. Auditor will deliver the recommendations to Company at a Summary of Findings meeting, implement recommendations that Company elects for Auditor to implement, and deliver a complete telecommunications inventory to Company.

While Auditor is performing its analysis, Company will not make changes or perform internal cost reduction analysis with respect to provider accounts which Company has included within the scope of Auditor's review.

- 2. Fees. Company will pay Auditor the applicable fee set forth below ONLY for Auditor recommendations implemented within twelve (12) months of Auditor delivering the recommendation to Company:
 - · 50% of any "Cost Recovery", as defined below
 - 12 times any "Service Elimination Savings", as defined below
 - 12 times any "Cost Reduction Savings", as defined below

"Cost Recovery" is any refund, credit or compensation received by Company relating to past services or charges.

"Service Elimination Savings" is any monthly cost reduction received by Company relating to cancellation of any service, including monthly usage cost reduction (calculated as the average of the last 2 months of usage costs associated with the cancelled service).

"Cost Reduction Savings" is any monthly cost reduction received by Company relating to the modification, consolidation or negotiation of any service, account or contract, including post discount usage rate improvement (calculated as the (a) decrease in post discount per unit pricing realized by Company for any service, times (b) the average of Company's last two (2) months usage levels measured in such units for the modified service).

- 3. Invoicing and Payment. Fees for Cost Recovery are due as a one-time payment within thirty (30) days of verification that Company has been issued the refund, credit or compensation resulting in such fees. However, fees for Service Elimination Savings and Cost Reduction Savings are due in two (2) installments, the first of which is due within thirty (30) days after verification that the cancellation or other activity resulting in the Service Elimination Savings or Cost Reduction Savings has been completed, and the second of which is due within thirty (30) days after July 1, 2021. The amount of the first installment will be equal to the amount of Service Elimination Savings or Cost Reduction Savings, as applicable, that Company will realize after implementation through June 30, 2020. The amount of the second installment will be equal to the remainder of fees owed to Auditor as calculated under this Agreement. In no event, will both installments together be greater than 12 times the Service Elimination Savings and Cost Reduction Savings as provided for in Section 2 hereof.
- 4. Termination of Agreement: Either party may terminate this Agreement by giving the other party thirty (30) days written notice.

 The expiration or termination of this Agreement for any reason does not terminate the rights and obligations of the parties under Section 5 which shall survive any expiration or termination. The expiration or termination of this Agreement for any reason also does not terminate the obligations of Company under Sections 2 and 3 of this Agreement to pay Auditor fees if Company elects to implement any of the recommendations made by Auditor within twelve (12) months of Auditor delivering the recommendation to Company (even if Company implements such recommendations on their own).
- 5. Miscellaneous. This agreement is governed by the laws of the State of lowa, without regard to principles of conflicts of law, and may be executed by facsimile and simultaneously in multiple counterparts. Company agrees that Auditor does not warranty the overall performance, Company satisfaction, or data accuracy of any telecommunications related carrier, provider, software manufacturer or vendor at any time whatsoever during or after the term of this agreement. Each person signing this agreement on behalf of a party represents that he or she has been duly authorized to sign this agreement and to bind the party on whose behalf this agreement is being signed by that signatory. AUDITOR SHALL NOT BE LIABLE TO THE COMPANY FOR INCIDENTAL, CONSEQUENTIAL, SPECIAL OR PUNITIVE DAMAGES, INCLUDING, WITHOUT LIMITATION, LOST PROFITS OR BUSINESS INTERRUPTION, WHETHER SUCH LIABILITY IS ASSERTED ON THE BASIS OF CONTRACT, TORT OR OTHERWISE, EVEN IF EITHER PARTY HAS BEEN WARNED OF THE POSSIBILITY OF ANY SUCH LOSS OR DAMAGE IN ADVANCE. IN ADDITION, IN NO EVENT SHALL AUDITOR'S LIABILITY TO COMPANY EXCEED THE FEES ACTUALLY PAID BY COMPANY TO AUDITOR.





The Council requested I investigate the concerns of Robert Lowe about the property at 1023 10th Street and the use of the garage abutting the alley.

The garage was legally built in 2019 and with the construction the City was required to improve the alley by placing gravel in the alley. Joshua Angus, the owner, stated he was going to install a hoist in the garage and I told him there is nothing in the zoning ordinances or building code that would not allow a hoist to be installed in a garage. Joshua stated he liked to rebuild cars as a hobby and would on occasion allow his friends to use the hoist in the garage. I told him that would not be a problem but that he could not make it a business.

I have over the last 2 weeks spoke with the neighbors abutting the alley and found no one that shared Mr. Lowe's concerns about the use of the garage and Mr. Angus has stated that he does not accept payment for use of the garage or any work that he done. Mr. Angus has a full time job during the week.

It is my opinion that the concerns with the use of the garage comes from the improvement of the alley that has allowed access to the rear of the properties abutting it and lessened the seclusion enjoyed by property owner.

HAZMAT REFRESHER:

Des Moines Fire Department is considered our regional hazmat team should we have an incident involving a spill of a hazardous material. On August 26, 2020, Lt. Brian Davis and Lt. Devon Sadler from DMFD provided our annual 4 hour Hazmat Operations Refresher. This 4 hour annual course is required by OSHA for all fire departments who have certified firefighters on their roster. A majority of our membership are trained Firefighter I firefighters (many have more certifications of higher levels). The course was very well done and allowed our members to understand chemical properties much better. The WISER phone app was uploaded by our members. This resource along with the new 2020 Emergency Response Guide we received this week will help our department quickly identify chemicals and more rapidly establish an evacuation distance. We hope we don't have to utilize this training but we have over 49,000 rail cars of ethanol passing through our city annually, so we need to be prepared.

CPR SAVE

On August 24, 2020, Sgt. Brandes, Detective Henderson, and I performed CPR on a resident of Nevada who suffered a cardiac arrest. The paramedics and two first responders arrived after the patient had a successful return of spontaneous circulation (ROSC), as a result of CPR being initiated within minutes of the 9-1-1 call. Police officers managed the airway by providing oxygen using a bag-valve-mask device. An AED was applied to the patient which was obtained from a NPSD vehicle. The patient was flown to Des Moines and is still alive as of the date of this report. In the latest update after speaking with hospital

staff, the patient has developed some in-hospital complications to health which may diminish the successful field outcome. However, the benefits of having trained police officer EMTs continues to show positive patient outcomes. Incidentally, one of the paramedics responding to this call tripped on a curb and was injured to the point of being on medical leave for six weeks. The trained NPSD staff helped assure the continuation of care was not affected.

LOW PRESSURE HOSE TECHNOLOGY


NFD is not afraid to research new technology. Much like UHP technology changing the way we fight fires, low pressure hose is fast emerging technology. Last week Chief Cory Snowgren from Denison FD and Jeff Feller from Sandry Fire Equipment let our firefighters demonstrate and document water flow rates using low pressure Combat Ready fire hose. We know whether it is fast water from UHP or large water for a well-developed fire, it still takes water to put fires out.

The Key Combat Ready and Combat Sniper hose shown below does not kink when the line is charged. Effective fire attack relies on delivery of GPM vs. BTUs. In other words appropriate water flow for the heat production made by the fire is needed to achieve extinguishment. Our department put a flow meter on our hose and on the Combat Ready hose to compare the results.

Firefighters will partially close the nozzle bale, dial down the gallons per minute on the nozzle or intentionally kink the hose so the hose can be easily handled. All of these actions restrict the water gallons needed in order to put out the fire and endanger the firefighter.

We tested our current hose and found in order to flow 150 gallons per minute, two people were needed to hold the hose and control the nozzle force pushing backward. Using combat ready hose, one person could easily control the hose with one hand flowing the same 150 gpm. In fact one person could manage the hose while flowing up to 180 gallons per minute. Another interesting fact with this hose design, our engine could provide 180 gallons per minute operating the pump barely above idle. This discovery means more success on the fire ground when the engine is short-staffed.

Combat Ready hose on a $7/8^{th}$ inch smooth bore nozzle provides more water, less nozzle force, and less wear and tear on the engine pump.



This technology does not come free of course. One 50 foot section of Combat Ready hose costs \$249. It is hard to imagine the design of a fire hose could change so many things in delivering water to a fire. The department is looking to purchase 400 feet of Combat Ready hose with a smooth bore nozzle for those well-developed fires needing an extra punch of water.
