Director of Fire/EMS Reynolds advised staff is reviewing extrication tools to purchase with their grant money. Council commended the Fire Department for their support of the Tendall Family.

Police Sergeant Brandes relayed Officer Syndes was still in the FTO program and the two at the academy are about half way through. The department still has one opening.

City Clerk Wright noted the Council budget committee will meet immediately following the next council meeting and the Budget Workshops have been scheduled if anyone would like to attend let her know.

City Engineer Stevens updated council on the projects.



## Special Use Permit Application Packet

1. Application Packet: Be sure to complete and submit all the required materials that are a part of this Application Packet. Failure to do so will result in a delay in accepting your application until it is complete:

The "Application Packet" for a Site Development Plan includes the following:

- Application Form (This form must be filled out completely for all applications.);
- Site Development Plan Checklist (Use this Checklist to prepare the Site Development Plan.); and,

### 2. What must be submitted?

- One (1) completed and signed Application Form.
- Ten (10) copies of the Special Use Plan, drawn to scale on a sheet no larger than 24" x
   36"
- Additional materials, as specified on the Special Use Checklist:
- A check or cash for the application filing fee as established by the City Council

No application will be accepted unless it complies with all the submittal requirements. Applications that are incomplete will be returned to the applicant without further review.

### 3. What is the Process?

- Submit all required items to the Planning and Zoning Department
- The Planning & Zoning Commission shall hold a **Public Hearing** and review the Special Use Application and approve or deny the Special Use Application based upon the **Special Use Checklist** and conformance with the Zoning Ordinance, Subdivision Regulations, and the Comprehensive Plan within thirty days of filing. The Planning & Zoning Commission may require modification of a special use as a prerequisite for approval. Required modifications may be more restrictive than base district regulations.
- The Applicant may appeal the Planning & Zoning Commission's decision to the City Council within ten days of the decision. The City Council shall hear the appeal at the first available meeting after filing of the appeal.
- Approval is valid for two (2) years from the date of approval. The applicant is also responsible for obtaining all other approvals required by all other local, state, and federal agencies. A Building/Zoning Permit may be issued once required approvals have been received.





Resolution Declaring Intent to provide Economic Development Support to Development Project at 1114 6th Street

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Nevada, Iowa (the "City") previously established the Nevada Urban Renewal Area (the "Urban Renewal Area") and adopted an urban renewal plan (the "Plan") for the governance of initiatives and projects therein; and

WHEREAS, The Camelot Theater Foundation (the "Developer") has proposed to undertake a commercial development project (the 'Project") on the property (the "Property") situated at 1114 6th Street in the City; and

WHEREAS, the Project will include the renovation of the theater area and upstairs apartments, acquire north building to add kitchen and restrooms with rooftop seating; and

WHEREAS, the Developer intends to make application to Story County ARPA Funding for the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Developer has requested that the City declare its intent to support the project and provide future fiscal support to the Project through an economic development grant (the "Grant") in the amount of \$20,000; and (b) Waiving of fees for permits and inspections for the selected property and encouraging staff to volunteer in the restoration efforts through the City's Wellness Program; and

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the City Council of the City of Nevada, Iowa, as follows:

Section 1. The City hereby expresses its intent to support the Project in the future. The City will, in good faith, negotiate a Development Agreement with the Developer with respect to the Project, such proposed Agreement to minimally include the following terms:

- A) The Developer will commit to undertaking the Project, investing a certain minimum amount of dollars into the Project and meeting certain performance benchmarks with respect to the completion, maintenance, use and operation of the Project; and
- B) In order to satisfy the Local Contribution Requirement and to provide support to the Project, the City will agree to (i) fund an economic development grant to the Developer to purchase the building for Project equal to \$20,000 and (ii) Waiving of fees for permits and inspections for the selected property and encouraging staff to volunteer in the restoration efforts through the City's Wellness Program.
- C) The City's economic development grant to the Developer will be considered it's contribution for any future grants that are applied for by the Developer.

Section 2. The Mayor is hereby authorized to sign such documentation as may be reasonably requested by the Developer to show the City's support for the Project and the

corresponding application for grant assistance, provided that such documentation is consistent with the terms of this Resolution.

Section 3. The City hereby agrees to use its best efforts to complete the statutory requirements of Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa in order to amend its urban renewal plan and to authorize the Development Agreement. Both the City and the Developer acknowledge that the City's commitment in this Section is merely a present statement of intent and that the City Council must exercise its ordinary political discretion in the completion of the statutory processes referenced herein. The City will not be held liable in the event that the City Council, through the exercising of its ordinary political discretion, determines to not approve any of the actions outlined herein.







# AMENDMENT TO GAS FACILITIES EXTENSION AGREEMENT

This Amendment is made this 13th-day of October 2021, by and between the City of Nevada, Iowa Wastewater Treatment Plant at 62512 270th St, Nevada, Iowa, and Interstate Power and Light corporation, an Iowa corporation headquartered at 200 First Street SE, Cedar Rapids, IA ("Company"), the parties to a Gas Facilities Extension Agreement dated the 8th day of March, 2021 and designated by Company as Contract No. 54440 (the "Agreement").

The parties have reached an understanding regarding the Agreement, and by this Amendment reduce the understanding to binding form.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants, terms, and conditions set forthin the Agreement, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree to amend the Agreement as follows:

See Exhibit A, attached. Description of Revision:

- The gas main extension project was designed by the Company to install approximately 15,900 feet of new gas main along 620th Ave and 270th St to provide service to the new City of Nevada Wastewater Treatment Facility/Plant. (Original Route)
- The advance in aid of construction in Exhibit B of Agreement 54440 was based on the costs for the Original Route.
- It was deemed desirable by the Company to construct the gas main extension to provide for additional residential/commercial development. The scope of the project was adjusted to include approximately 19,850 feet of new gas main, extending along a route on S. 11th St / Country Club Rd, to S. 19th St. to 270th St. (Alternate Route)
- The excess construction costs of the Alternate Route shall be borne by the Company. The design of the Alternate Route initially included approximately 3,950 additional feet of gas main.
- Recently, a residential developer requested natural gas service to a new development that required
  the extension of approximately 900 feet of gas main from S. K. Ave. to S. 11th St. The developer
  requested natural gas service prior to the planned start of construction to serve the new City of
  Nevada Wastewater Treatment Facility/Plant.
- In accordance with the Company's General Rules and Regulation for Gas Service, Extension Policy, this Developer paid an advance in aid of construction toward the gas main extension. This advance reduced the Company's excess construction costs along the Alternate Route. The developer is eligible for refunds for a period of ten years for each service line attached to the distribution main extension along the extension to the development.
- The revised Exhibit A attached shows a revised starting point of the gas main extension required to serve the new City of Nevada Wastewater Treatment Facility/Plant (Revised Alternate Route).
- The advance in aid of construction listed in Exhibit B of Agreement 54440 for City of Nevada remains unchanged. The Company will continue to bear the cost of the excess construction costs for the Revised Alternate Route.
- The City of Nevada retains the ability to receive a pro-rata refund of the advance amount in Agreement 54440, for a period of ten years for each service line attached to the distribution main extension along the Revised Alternate Route.

Except as amended herein, the Agreement, including any prior amendments, shall remain unchanged.

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# GAS FACILITIES EXTENSION AGREEMENT (ADVANCE)

THIS AGREEMENT, made this 8th day of March	20.21 between
Interstate Power and Light Company, hereinafter called the Company, and	d City of Nevada, lowa
, hereinafter called the Customer/Developer.	

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Company is engaged in the distribution of gas in the City of Nevada, Iowa; and

WHEREAS, the Customer/Developer is the owner of the following legally described premises: Wastewater Treatment Plant, 62512 270<sup>th</sup> St, Nevada, Iowa, as shown on the map attached hereto (marked Exhibit A) and made a part hereof, and

WHEREAS, the Company desires to sell natural gas to the ultimate owners or occupants of the residences, or other buildings being built or installed on said premises, and the Customer/Developer desires to have natural gas available for such residences or other buildings to be used for heating, water heating, cooking and other uses, hereinafter called gas service.

# NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The Company agrees to construct, install, maintain and operate natural gas facilities to serve said premises; upon application for gas service made by the owner or occupant of each such building.
- 2. The Customer/Developer agrees to advance to the Company the estimated cost of construction of gas facilities, as set out in Exhibit B, attached, and the Company agrees to refund to the Customer/Developer the cost of installing the facilities, as set forth in Paragraph 4 below.
- For the purpose of this agreement, the Company's estimated cost and the Customer/Developer advance for this gas extension are shown on Exhibit B.
- 4. The Customer/Developer agrees to advance \$312,289,85 to the Company payable prior to the commencement of construction. Upon acceptance by the Company of each application for gas service by Customer/Developers along the extensions contemplated herein, the Company shall refund Customer/Developer's advances in accordance with the Company's Gas Tariff Extension policy on file with the Iowa Utilities Board. The Company shall not be obligated to refund more than the original amount advanced and the refunds shall be without interest.
- 5. The obligation of the Company to make refund to the Customer/Developers shall be null and void after the expiration of ten (10) years from the date of this agreement, and any and all monies remaining unrefunded in the hands of the Company shall then become the sole property of the Company.
- 6. The Customer/Developer agrees to furnish at his own expense all necessary easements and permits required for the installation of said gas main, and the Customer/Developer and the Company will cooperate so that said construction and installation can be accomplished in the most economical manner.

- Title to all gas facilities installed pursuant to this agreement shall be in the Company. 7.
- Applications for gas service referred to above shall be subject to and pursuant to applicable rules and regulations of the Company effective at the date of said applications with respect to the availability of natural gas and the rates and charges for same.

AGENDA ITEM: Fire Department Purchase of a Battery-Operated Extrication Tools Using the FEMA Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG)

HISTORY: In 2008, with assistance from a FEMA grant, the fire department purchased two sets of TNT extrication tools (also known in earlier days as the "Jaws of Life"). The tools require a gas-powered motor and hydraulic pump to be tethered to the tool. Extrication tools general consist of a spreader used to spread open vehicle doors, cutters used to cut metal A-posts, and rams used for pushing the dash off a person. Extrication tools are vital to today's fire service mission.

In February 2018, the fire department responded to a 70-car pile-up and a 50-car pile-up on I-35 within the same week. You can probably imagine the difficulty in dragging a tool, a motor, and 20 feet of thick hydraulic hose through a scene with 70 cars and 15 people needing extrication during blizzard-like conditions. The existing tools we have are 13 years old and we have seen them fail to cut the Advanced High Strength Steel (AHSS) found in newer vehicles. In one case, the pivot bolt broke attempting to cut a field sprayer boom involved in a serious crash. This took the cutters out of service for a week. We intend to keep the existing tools on our rescue engine as a back-up or for complex scenes requiring multiple tools.

Last month, FEMA awarded the City of Nevada \$47,276.19 for the purchase of new lithium-ion battery operated extrication tools through the Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG). E-tools as they are called are tether-free and more maneuverable. The cutting and spreading powers are rated at 15,000 lbs. In other words, these tools are designed for next generation cars made with AHSS. The department tested Hurst, Genesis, and Amkus extrication tools on three separate nights at Central Iowa Towing. The members scored the tools on use, function, weight, and other features presented. The Amkus tools were quickly removed from consideration due to the weight of the tool being 57.6 lbs. It was too heavy for a single person to use and operate at waist height. The members were split between the Hurst and Genesis tool. The operation of the Hurst tools was impressive and the turn lever is something most of the members are use to in our existing tools. However, the battery for the Genesis tool is universal (Milwaukee) and can be used in cordless drills, impact drivers, saw-saws, and the Supervac fan saving money in the long run. Several of our members who work on other departments work with the Genesis tools. All tools have a 10-year warranty and a 5-year warranty on batteries.

The department leadership would like to order a combination tool and E-pack battery box from Genesis (Bid #1), and a cutter and spreader from Hurst (Bid #2). We already have a set of TNT gas tools so the principle of cutting open a car does not change just because more than one brand of tool is used on a scene. We are very experienced on extrication since we respond to two major divided roadways. We are not concerned with having different brands of extrication tools.

The remaining AFG funds after the purchase are anticipated at \$10,755. After the purchase of the E-tools, FEMA will allow those remaining funds to be used for purchasing approved fire-fighting equipment. The bids and equipment are as follows:

- 3. Reject all bids, and have staff consider other options.

# STAFF'S RECOMMENDED ACTION:

The fire department and Director of Fire and EMS recommend the purchase of this necessary equipment.

Therefore, it is the recommendation of the City Administrator that Council approves Option #1, accepting Bid #1 and #2 together for the purchase of battery-operated extrication tools.

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# Current Ordinance 1tem#

# 41.13 FIREWORKS.

The sale, use or exploding of fireworks within the City is subject to the following:

1. Definition. For purposes of this section, definitions are enumerated in the Iowa Code section 727.2, which definitions are incorporated herein by reference.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 727.2)

Sales - General Requirements.

A. Prior to any person engaging in the sale of consumer fireworks, the following shall be provided to the fire chief:

- (1) License: Proof of valid license issued from the state fire marshal.
- (2) Liability Insurance: Proof of liability insurance separate from the building property insurance specifically showing coverage of fireworks sales for an aggregate amount of \$2,000,000.
- (3) Fire Inspection: Any property, building, or premise whether it be permanent or temporary, intended for the sale of consumer fireworks shall have an initial fire inspection completed by the fire chief prior to engaging in the sale of consumer fireworks. The fire chief or their designee shall cause an annual inspection to occur meeting the requirements of the National Fire Protection Code 1124 (2006 edition) and the current fire code adopted by the City of Nevada. Inspection Costs shall be assessed as follows:
  - a. Permanent Structure where fireworks are sold Annual inspection fee of \$100.
- b. Temporary or Non-Brick or Mortar Building where fireworks are sold Annual inspection fee of \$200.
- B. Dates of Sale: Consumer fireworks sales shall only be conducted in accordance with dates and times designated by Iowa Code Section 727.2. It shall be unlawful to sell consumer fireworks without meeting the requirements specified in this ordinance, or to sell fireworks outside of the dates specified.
- (1) Approved consumer fireworks sales meeting the requirements of this chapter shall be allowed from an approved permanent structure or building between June 1 and July 8 and from December 10 until January 3.
- (2) Approved consumer fireworks sales meeting the requirements of this chapter shall be allowed from an approved temporary structure between June 13 and July 8.
- C. Safety Requirements: The following safety requirements shall be adopted for all locations where consumer fireworks are sold:
- (1) All transportation, storage, and sales of consumer fireworks shall conform to the safety standards set forth by the National Fire Protection Code 1124 (2006 Edition), including but not limited to, those standards concerning separation distance requirements and aggregate weight limits.
- (2) There shall be no more than 1000 lbs of 1.4G consumer fireworks on site at any temporary structure sales location.
- (3) Any permanent structure used primarily for the purpose of consumer fireworks sales shall be located 35 feet from a property line, public roadway, alley, or highway; and 70 feet from an inhabited building.
- (4) Any temporary structure having between 500 and 1000 pounds of total aggregate weight of DOT 1.4 class consumer fireworks shall be located 55 feet from a property line, public roadway, alley, or highway; and 110 feet from an inhabited building.
- (5) Smoking, open flame source, or matches shall not be located within 50 feet where consumer fireworks are sold. The following exemptions apply:
- a. Lighters and matches may be sold as part of a retail business in commercial structures who engage in other merchandise sales where consumer fireworks are not the primary business.
- b. Locations that engage in consumer fireworks sales as a primary source of revenue may sell extended lighters so long as lighters are located in a sealed package and not opened within the store premises.
- (6) All electrical wiring shall meet NFPA 70 National Electrical Code. Permanent structures or buildings used primarily for consumer fireworks sales shall meet wiring requirements for a hazardous location, including covered light fixtures to avoid sparks upon failure or damage to lights.
  - (7) Locations shall maintain a 48-inch clear aisles between consumer fireworks display shelves.
- (8) Locations shall maintain two approved exits for egress during an emergency. All approved exits shall be clearly marked with signage; except that, exit signs shall be illuminated in permanent structures.

- (9) Consumer fireworks sales shall only be permitted in a single story at grade building or structure to facilitate easy exiting during an emergency.
- (10) Locations shall have a minimum of two 10 pound ABC rated fire extinguishers mounted in accordance with NFPA 10. Additional fire extinguishers shall be placed in locations to prevent travel distance exceeding 75 feet in order to reach a fire extinguisher.
- (11) All doors used as service doors outside the view of a clerk shall be locked to prevent unauthorized persons from entering the building unnoticed. If doors are approved exit doors as part of the two approved exits needed, they shall be operable without special tools, keys, or knowledge. Delayed or alarmed egress doors are permitted so long as release is activated within 8 seconds.
- (12) No persons under the influence of alcohol, drugs, or narcotics, shall be allowed to remain in the business where consumer fireworks are sold as a primary business.
- (13) No more than one conex container or approved explosive magazine shall be located on site for short-term storage of extra product. All containers shall be properly placarded and equipped with tamper proof locking devices. It is permitted to place containers in a security fenced area.
- (14) Individual consumer fireworks devices or opened consumer fireworks packages shall not be permitted to be displayed. No open fuses shall be exposed during storage inside a sales location.
  - (15) Consumer fireworks sales shall only be allowed in areas zoned for commercial use.
- (16) Any person engaged in consumer firework sales in any other zone other than commercial zoned areas shall not be approved for sales within the city limits.
  - (17) No person shall sell a DOT 1.4 class consumer firework to a person under the age of 18.
- (18) Consumer fireworks shall not be sold to an intoxicated person or to any person whom a reasonable person would believe may be impaired by other substances.
  - 3. Fireworks Discharging General Requirements.
- A. No person under the age of 18 shall discharge a DOT 1.4 class consumer firework without parental supervision.
- B. A person shall only discharge a consumer fireworks device on real property they own or on property where consent has been given and the property owner is present. Novelties, including snakes, sparklers, or caps, can be discharged on a public place so long as all trash, wrappers, and wires are properly disposed of.

(Ord. 1000 - Aug. 18 Supp.)

- C. Consumer fireworks shall not be discharged by persons showing visible signs of, or determined to be, intoxicated or under the influence of a drug or narcotic.
- D. Any person discharging a consumer fireworks device assumes all responsibility for its operation and the consequences thereof. No person shall discharge a consumer fireworks device in a reckless manner or manner likely to cause death, injury, fire, or property damage.
  - E. No person shall discharge a consumer fireworks device outside the following dates and hours:
    - (1) July 1 thru July 4 from the hours of 6 pm until 10 pm.

Exception: discharge hours are extended from noon to 11 pm on July 4th only.

(2) December 29 and 30 from the hours of 5 pm until 9 p.m.; December 31 from the hours of 5 pm until 11:59 pm; and January 1 from the hours of 12 am-12:30 am and 5 pm until 9 pm.

(Ord. 1000 - Aug. 18 Supp.)

- F. It shall be unlawful to alter, remove, or discharge components of a consumer fireworks device from its intended method of discharging.
- G. Sky lantern open flame devices are not permitted to be released within the city limits, except if tethered by a retrievable rope so long as the person discharging has control over the sky lantern.
- H. The City may, upon application in writing, grant a permit for the display of display fireworks on public property by a City agency, fair associations, amusement parks and other organizations or groups of individuals approved by City authorities when such display fireworks display will be handled by a competent operator. No

permit shall be granted hereunder unless the operator or sponsoring organization has filed with the City evidence of insurance in the following amounts:

(1) Personal Injury: \$250,000 per person.

(2) Property Damage: \$50,000.(3) Total Exposure: \$1,000,000.


- 4. Violations. All violations of any provisions of this Chapter are hereby declared simple misdemeanors and/or municipal infractions. Violations may be prosecuted as either a misdemeanor criminal offense or a municipal infraction at the sole discretion of the fire chief or peace officer. Fines shall be set by resolution of the City Council. Violations of this chapter shall be reported to the state fire marshal.
- 5. Exceptions. This section does not prohibit the sale by a resident, dealer, manufacturer or jobber of such fireworks as are not prohibited; or the sale of any kind of fireworks if they are to be shipped out of State; or the sale or use of blank cartridges for a show or theater, or for signal purposes in athletic sports or by railroads or trucks for signal purposes, or by a recognized military organization. This section does not apply to any substance or composition prepared and sold for medicinal or fumigation purposes.

- HR Green surveyed sanitary sewers in the area of the proposed subdivision to determine if some of the planned residential lots could be served without a lift station. It was determined first floor elevations would need to be raised and lower basement ceilings would be required.
- Participated in the updated Capital Improvement Plan.
- Provided a street condition map based on data from the Iowa Pavement Management Program.
- Provided maps of the City to be used for future planning purposes.
- Assisted with determining appropriate sanitary sewer services for the Burgie's Coffee Shop and American Car Wash.

# Central Business District Infrastructure Improvements - 180306

- Lincoln Highway: All work was completed. There is an issue with ride with this street segment; the Contractor has measured the roughness, and remedial actions will be taken.
- 6<sup>th</sup> Street between Lincoln Highway and M Avenue: All underground utility work has been completed. Mainline paving and parking areas are complete.
- The additional block of water main work on 6th Street from M Avenue to N Avenue has been completed, except for the street patch in this area, which will be completed in the near future.

# Sponsored Projects - 191900

Nevada Sponsored Project Concept Design - 191900.02

- Concept design is continuing on the drainage tributaries from the Indian Ridge subdivision to West Indian Creek and the existing drainage area and channel near the Kiwanis Butterfly Garden Area.
- HR Green is still awaiting the jurisdictional ruling from the US Army Corps of Engineers on several locations in the Harrington Park and Wilson Pond project areas. The ruling requests were made 5/26/2021, and jurisdictional rulings usually take several months. Since these rulings will affect the design concept, concept work for Harrington Park and Wilson Pond are paused pending the ruling.
- Work on the North Stormwater Facility remains paused indefinitely pending further discussion between the City and private property owners.
