The Maximum Property Tax dollars requested in the total maximum levy for affected property tax levies for Fiscal Year 2022/2023 does not represent an increase of greater than 102% from the maximum property tax dollars requested in Fiscal Year 2021/2022.



- Names of all adjoining property owners within 100 feet.
- Existing and proposed zoning indicated.

Survey Data:

- Lengths, bearings and curve data of existing or proposed lots (except internal lot lines) blocks, public or
 private way, railroad or utility right-of-way, deed restrictions, covenants, easements, dedications or other
 areas within the tract or parcel proposed to be subdivided.
- The outer boundaries of the tract or parcel proposed to be subdivided drawn in a solid, bold black line.

Existing Physical Features:

- · Location, use and dimensions of any existing structures, with the required setback distances indicated.



WHEREAS, the City of Nevada (the "City"), in Story County, State of Iowa proposes to enter into a General Obligation Urban Renewal Loan Agreement (the "Loan Agreement"), pursuant to the provisions of Section 384.24A and Section 384.24.3(q) of the Code of Iowa, and to borrow money thereunder in a principal amount not to exceed \$6,000,000 for the purpose to that extent, of undertaking the Recreation Center Development Project, an authorized urban renewal project in the Nevada Urban Renewal Area approved by action of the City Council on April 9, 2018 (the "Project"), and it is now necessary to fix a date of meeting of the City Council at which it is proposed to take action to enter into the Loan Agreement and to give notice thereof as required by such law, including notice of the right to petition for an election on such proposal;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the City Council of the City of Nevada, Iowa, as follows:

Section 1. This City Council shall meet on March 14, 2022, at the Nevada City Council Chambers, Nevada, Iowa, at 6:00 o'clock p.m., at which time and place a hearing will be held and proceedings will be instituted and action taken to enter into the Loan Agreement described in the preamble hereof.

Section 2. The City Clerk is hereby directed to give notice of the proposed action on the Loan Agreement setting forth the amount and purpose thereof, the time when and place where the said meeting will be held by publication at least once, not less than ten (10) and not more than twenty (20) days before the date of said meeting, in a legal newspaper which has a general circulation in the City. The notice shall be in substantially the following form:

NOTICE OF PROPOSED ACTION TO INSTITUTE PROCEEDINGS TO ENTER INTO A LOAN AGREEMENT AND TO BORROW MONEY THEREUNDER IN A PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$6,000,000

(GENERAL OBLIGATION)

The City Council of the City of Nevada, Iowa (the "City"), will meet on March 14, 2022, at the Nevada City Council Chambers, Nevada, Iowa, at 6:00 o'clock p.m., for the purpose of instituting proceedings and taking action on a proposal to enter into a loan agreement (the "Loan Agreement") and to borrow money thereunder in a principal amount not to exceed \$6,000,000 for the purpose of paying the costs, to that extent, of undertaking the Recreation Center Development Project, an authorized urban renewal project in the Nevada Urban Renewal Area approved by action of the City Council on April 9, 2018.

The Loan Agreement is proposed to be entered into pursuant to authority contained in Section 384.24A and Section 384.24.3(q) of the Code of Iowa and will constitute a general obligation of the City.

At any time before the date fixed for taking action to enter into the Loan Agreement, a petition may be filed with the City Clerk of the City asking that the question of entering into the Loan Agreement be submitted to the registered voters of the City, pursuant to the provisions of Section 384.26 of the Code of Iowa. If no such petition is filed, at the aforementioned time and place, oral or written objections may be filed or made to the proposal to enter into the Loan Agreement. After receiving objections, the City may determine to enter into the Loan Agreement, in which case, the decision will be final unless appealed to the District Court within fifteen (15) days thereafter.

This declaration is a declaration of official intent adopted pursuant to Section 1.150-2 of the Regulations.

Section 4. All resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 5. This resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption and approval, as provided by law.
