THIS Community Catalyst Building Remediation Grant Agreement ("Agreement") is made by and between the IOWA ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY, 1963 Bell Avenue, Suite 200, Des Moines, Iowa 50315 ("Authority" or "IEDA") and the City of Nevada, 1015 6th Street, Nevada, Iowa 50201 ("Grantee") (Collectively "the Parties").

WHEREAS, the Authority established a Community Catalyst Building Remediation Fund pursuant to Iowa Code section 15,231 for the purpose of providing grants to cities for the remediation of underutilized buildings; and

WHEREAS, the Grantee submitted a grant application to the Authority and the Authority determined that the Grantee and its proposed Project are eligible for a Community Catalyst Building Remediation Grant ("Grant") and approved the Application; and

WHEREAS, in approving the Application, the Authority has relied upon the Grantee's representations of proposed Project activities, the Grantee's management and financial condition, investment of other Project funds, and other material information contained in the application;

WHEREAS, the Grantee accepts the Grant upon the terms and conditions set out in this Agreement,

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises contained in this Agreement and other good and valuable consideration, the Parties agree as follows:

- COSTS DIRECTLY RELATED. "Costs Directly Related" means expenditures that are incurred for the acquisition, deconstruction, disposal, redevelopment, or rehabilitation of the community catalyst that is the subject of the Project to the extent that the expenditures are attributable directly to the remediation or redevelopment of the community catalyst. Examples of "Costs Directly Related" and costs that are not directly related are set out at 261 IAC 45.2 Definitions.
- GRANTEE, "Grantee" means the entity described above whose application for a Grant was approved by IEDA. 2.
- IOWAGRANTS, GOV. "IowaGrants.gov" means Iowa's Funding Opportunity Search and Grant Management System. The Authority reserves the right to require the Recipient to utilize lowaGrants.gov to conduct business associated with this Agreement.
- PROJECT. "Project" means the activities and other obligations to be performed or accomplished by the Grantee as described in this Agreement, in the Agreement Scope of Work attached hereto, in the award letter, and in the application submitted through lowaGrants.gov, including but not limited to, the "Scope of Project and Budget" portion of the application.
- PROJECT COMPLETION PERIOD. "Project Completion Period" means the period commencing with the Date of Award Letter and ending with the Project Completion Date set out above.
- PROJECT MID-POINT. "Project Mid-Point" means the point at which the Grantee has incurred Costs Directly Related to the Project. The maximum mid-point draw is up to 60% of the Grant Amount.
- PRIOR EXPENSES. No expenditures made prior to the Date of Award Letter may be included as Project costs for the purpose of this Agreement.
- UTILIZATION OF CONSULTANT(S). The Grantee is responsible for recruiting and selecting consultants and for setting out the terms and conditions under which the consultant(s) shall provide services. The Authority may require the Grantee to retain a consultant or consultants as set out in the Agreement Scope of Work attached hereto.
- TOTAL PAYMENT. Total payment of state funds under this Agreement shall not exceed \$100,000 for Costs Directly Related to the Project as shown in the approved application unless modified by written amendment of this Agreement. All payments under this Agreement are subject to receipt by the IEDA of sufficient State funds for this activity. Any termination, reduction or delay of state funds to the IEDA shall, at the option of the IEDA, result in the termination, reduction, or delay of state funds to the Grantee.
- REPAYMENT OBLIGATION. In the event that any state and/or federal funds are deferred and/or disallowed as a result of any audits or expended in violation of this Agreement or the laws applicable to the expenditure of such funds, the Grantee shall be liable to IEDA for the full amount of any claim disallowed and for all related penalties incurred. If IEDA determines at any time, whether through monitoring, audit, closeout procedures or by other means that the Grantee has received grant funds or requested reimbursement for costs which are unallowable under the terms of this Agreement or applicable laws, the Grantee will be notified of the questioned costs and given an opportunity to justify questioned costs prior to IEDA's final determination of the disallowance of costs. If it is IEDA's final determination that costs previously paid by IEDA are not allowable under the terms of this Agreement, the expenditures will be disallowed and the Grantee shall immediately repay to IEDA any and all disallowed costs. The requirements of this paragraph shall apply to the Grantee as well as any subcontractors.







ORDINANCE NO. 1052 (2023/2024)

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 41 (PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY) OF THE CITY CODE BY ADDING LANGUAGE PERTAINING TO STORAGE TANKS

BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Nevada, Iowa, as follows:

SECTION 1. SECTION MODIFIED. Chapter 41 (Public Health and Safety), Section 41.17 (Leaking Storage Tanks), Section 41.18 (Abandoned Storage Tanks), and Section 41.19 (Tanks Temporarily Out of Order) is hereby amended by adding:

41.17 - Leaking storage tanks.

If underground tanks for the storage of flammable or combustible liquid are found to be leaking, the chief of the fire department shall be notified at once. The chief shall have the authority to order the immediate removal of the tanks from the ground and the moving of the tanks to a safe location. The excavation from which the tanks are removed shall be left open until the chief of the fire department shall determine that it is safe to refill the excavation.

41.18 - Abandoned storage tanks.

The abandonment of any underground storage tank used for the storage of flammable or combustible liquids shall be regulated and controlled by the requirements and provisions of the International Fire Code, specifically Section 5704.2.13, except that all abandoned underground storage tanks shall be removed and the hole filled. The removal of above-ground and underground tanks shall comply with Section 5704.2.14.1. The chief of the fire department shall direct and supervise the removal of abandoned underground storage tanks.

41.19 - Tanks temporarily out of service.

Any underground tank used for storage of flammable or combustible liquids, temporarily out of service, shall be pumped empty of product, and input and output openings shall be properly sealed and the tank shall be properly vented. If any such tank is not so sealed and vented within ten days after having been temporarily taken out of service, it shall be deemed abandoned. The chief of the fire department shall be notified when the tanks are to be emptied and sealed, and such shall be done with his supervision and approval.

SECTION 2. REPEALER. All ordinances or parts or ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 4. WHEN EFFECTIVE. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.







ATTACHMENT A SCOPE OF SERVICES

The project is described as design and bidding services for a 10' wide shared-use path (trail) along the west side of 19th Street, between South G Avenue and Lincoln Highway, in Nevada, Iowa. The project will be based on the schematic design plan completed in February, 2023. The work to be completed by the Consultant under this agreement shall encompass and include detail work, services, materials, equipment and supplies necessary to perform project management and administration; trail design (grading and paving); and bid phase services.

The specific services to be provided are described in the following pages.

I. BACKGROUND

This scope of work involves design and bidding services for the 19th Street Trail project. The scope also includes such services as data collection, construction schedules, and opinion of cost.

The Consultant Team will provide the following services:

HR Green, Inc. (Consultant)

- Project Management and Administration
- Shared Use Path (Trail) Design
- Bid Phase Services

Clapsaddle-Garber Associates, Inc. (CGA)

• Permanent Easement Acquisition Plat

II. DETAILED WORK TASKS

Task A – Project Management and Administration

The work tasks to be performed under Project Management and Administration shall consist of the following:

A.1 Development of Project Instructions, Schedule, and Detailed Work Plan

Prepare written instructions for project staff. Provide background, names of contacts, communications procedures, responsibilities, schedule and budget information, and other important elements for the project. Establish a graphic project schedule indicating critical dates, milestones, and deliverables. Prepare a detailed work plan with specific staff assignments, by task, corresponding to the schedule.

A.2 Coordination with Project Stakeholders

Maintain communications with City of Nevada (Owner) staff. Meet with the Stakeholders to review progress, discuss specific elements of the project, promote communication between the various entities, and expedite the project development process. Prepare minutes of meetings and prepare action items and keep documentation of other communications.

- One (1) design meeting in Nevada with the Owner's staff are anticipated in this scope of services. It is assumed one (1) staff member of the Consultant will participate in the meeting. The following Design Meeting is included:
 - o Check Plan (95%)
- Other meetings are described under the specific work tasks.

A.3 Project Management

The project manager for the Consultant will be responsible for general coordination with the Owner regarding

project activities, meetings, invoicing, and deliverables. This task includes interoffice administration and coordination of the project including periodic interoffice meetings, which will be attended by the project manager and task managers, as well as general day-to-day administrative tasks.

- Prepare meeting minutes and action items.
- Track progress; monitor and maintain monthly project schedules.
- Distribution of plans and coordination of responses.
- Notifications as needed.
- Billing monthly status reports / billing should include earned value calculations showing percent spent, percent completed and scheduled percent completed.

Task B - Survey and Mapping

The development of a permanent easement acquisition plat of survey will be completed by Clapsaddle-Garber Associates, Inc. Service will include:

B.1 Permanent Easement Survey, Legal Description, Exhibit

This item consists of providing signed permanent easement plat of survey anticipated for 1800 Lincoln Highway, the corner property at Lincoln Highway and 19th Street. It is understood the City will negotiate and acquire the easement.

Task C - Final Design - Check and Final Plan Preparation

Following the completion of preliminary design and plan preparation the Consultant shall subsequently proceed with final design, contract drawings, project manual, and opinion of costs for the proposed improvements. Plan preparation shall conform to the Iowa Statewide Urban Design and Specifications (SUDAS). Final documents will be of sufficient detail to allow for construction with oversight and include:

C.1 Title Sheet (A Sheet)

This item consists of finalizing the title sheet. The title sheet will include the following: Index of Sheets, Index of Standard Road Plans, Mileage Summary, Legend, Location Map, Project Number, Letting Date and Design Designation

C.2 Typical Sections and Details (B sheets)

This item consists of final design and drafting of typical cross sections and typical details to be utilized for the improvements.

C.3 Estimate of Quantities and Tabulations (C Sheets)

This item consists of final bid items to be included in the Project as well as final quantity tabulations and the development of the general notes and estimate reference information. This item also includes the final tabulation of various elements to be provided on the Project.

C.4 Plan and Profile (D Sheets)

This item consists of the final design and drafting of plan and profiles for proposed trail improvements. Includes base mapping, proposed trail alignments, slope intercepts, existing right-of-way/easements, drive entrances, side road intersections, intersecting angles and station equation between mainline and side road reference line will also be shown. Profiles will show proposed elevations, grades, vertical curve length and "K" value, elevations for PVC, PVI, and PVT.

Assumptions:

- The trail will be an 10' wide HMA path, 6" thick. (15' at locations adjacent to existing roadway)
- The trail will be constructed within the existing street right-of-way (Except where the permanent easement is anticipated to be acquired).

C.5 Reference Ties & Benchmarks (G sheets)

Plan showing reference ties (including control points) and benchmarks used to develop the project design and to be preserved throughout construction of the project.

C.6 Right-of-Way and Easements (H sheets)

This task consists of the development of existing right-of-way and easement plan sheets. Right-of-Way features such as existing access rights, property ownership and parcel information shall be included.

C.7 Storm Drainage Plan and Profile (M sheets)

This item consists of final design and drafting of the storm sewer plan and profile, including sewer structure types and elevations, and storm sewer pipe sizes, slopes and flow lines.

C.8 Geometric, Staking & Joint Layout (L/S sheets)

This item consists of final design and drafting of the geometric layouts of the trail, as well as, jointing and ADA ramps and compliance tabulations.

C.9 Cross Sections (W sheets)

This item consists of the final design and drafting of individual cross sections for the Project. Cross sections will be designed and drawn at 50-foot maximum intervals, with additional cross sections included as necessary. Cross-sections will show the existing ground elevations as well as the final project grading, including foreslope and backslope information, special subgrade treatment, pavement, and other pertinent information.

C.10 Preparation of Project Manual

The task consists of preparation of a Project Manual for the Project, including Notice of Hearing and Letting, Instruction to bidders, Bid forms, Bond Forms, Agreement Forms, General Conditions of Construction Contract, Supplementary General Conditions, and Detailed Construction Specifications.

C.11 Opinion of Probable Cost

Prepare a Final Opinion of Probable Construction Cost. The Opinion of Probable Construction Cost is intended for the use of the Owner in Financing the Project. The cost opinion will be submitted with the Final Plans.

C.12 Field Exam

Consists of the preparation of materials for a field exam, participation in the field exam and reviewing results of the field exam with the Owner. For budget purposes, it is assumed that one (1) staff member of the Consultant will attend the Field Exam.

Task D - Bid Phase Services

The work tasks to be performed under Bid Phase Services shall consist of the following:

D.1 Printing Plans and Specifications

This task consists of printing and handling of the Plans and Specifications. For budget purposes, it is estimated that twenty (20) half-size (11"x17") plan sets and specifications will be duplicated and assembled for distribution. This task also includes dissemination of the contract documents and maintaining a plan holders list during the bidding phase.

D.2 Notice of Project

The Consultant shall assist in the preparation of the formal Notice of Hearing and Letting. Publication and costs shall be borne by the Owner. The Consultant shall also prepare and disseminate an informal notice to Contractors concerning the upcoming Project.

D.3 Plan Clarification and Addenda

The Consultant shall be available to answer questions from Contractors prior to the letting and shall issue addenda as appropriate to interpret, clarify or expand the bidding documents.

D.4 Letting, Bid Tabs, and Award Recommendation

The Consultant shall be a representative present when the bids and proposals are opened, shall make tabulation of bids for the Owner, shall advise the Owner on the responsiveness of the bidders, and assist the Owner in making the award of contract. After the awards are made, the Consultant shall provide the necessary contract documents to the Contractor for their completion.

III. PROJECT SCHEDULE

After given the Notice to Proceed (NTP), the Consultant shall complete the following phases of the Project in accordance with the schedule shown:

2024 STREET IMPROVEMENTS DIVISION 1, STREET RECONSTRUCTION CONSTRUCTION PHASE SERVICES NEVADA, IA

Scope of Services:

The CITY agrees to employ COMPANY to perform the following Construction Phase Services for the 2024 Street Improvements Project:

Project Submittal Reviews

The Consultant shall review acceptability of the Contractor's submittals, such as shop drawings, product data, samples and other data, which the Contractor is required to submit, but only for the limited purpose of checking for conformance with the design concept and the information shown in the Construction Documents. This review shall not include review of the accuracy or completeness of details, such as quantities, dimensions, weights or gauges, fabrication processes, construction means or methods, coordination of the work with other trades or construction safety precautions, all of which are the sole responsibility of the Contractor. The Consultant's review shall be conducted with reasonable promptness while allowing sufficient time in the Consultant's judgment to permit adequate review. The Consultant shall not be responsible for any deviations from the Construction Documents not brought to the attention of the Consultant in writing by the Contractor. The Consultant shall not be required to review partial submissions or those for which submissions of correlated items have not been received. The Consultant shall have authority to require special inspection or testing of the work, and shall receive and review all certificates of inspections, testing, and approvals required by law, rules, regulations, ordinances, codes, orders or the Plans.

Site Visits

The Senior Staff of the Consultant shall make visits to the site and at intervals appropriate to the various stages of construction as requested by the City. It is estimated that ten (10) site visits will be required involving one (1) senior staff member for this effort.

Such visits by the Senior Staff of the Consultant are not to be construed as part of the observation duties by the City's on-site observation personnel.

Partial Pay Estimates

The Consultant will review pay request documents submitted by the contractor. The Consultant will verify with the City's construction observation personnel the accuracy of the request. The Consultant will determine the amounts owed to the


LOCATION MAP

AGENDA ITEM: Approve animal sheltering services contract

HISTORY:

The Nevada Public Safety Department (NPSD) provides animal control services for the City of Nevada. Part of the animal control services include impounding animals for various reasons. Animals that need to be impounded are collected by NPSD staff and transported to a third party for sheltering and care.

The existing contract is expired and a renewal of services is needed. A request for proposal was sent to all veterinarian facilities in the City of Nevada.

OPTIONS:

- 1. Approve staff recommendation to accept contract service with Story County Animal Shelter.
- 2. Continue services with Nevada Vet Clinic, accepting new updates to existing contract.
- 3. Reject all bids.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends approval of #1.

Therefore, it is the recommendation of the City Administrator that Council approves Option #1, approve staff recommendation to accept contract service with Story County Animal Shelter.

CONSIDERATIONS USED:

The decision to support a contract with the Story County Animal Shelter consists of multiple factors. With the addition to the Animal Shelter in previous years, their holding capacity has increased. This will allow them to offer sheltering services to Nevada. The Animal Shelter has a kennel system that allows for contactless feeding and watering. This is important for animals classified as a "Bite Animal". The contactless kennels will allow for animals that may not have been able to be impounded in the past to now be held.

The current practice of NPSD in regards to feral cats is to treat them as nuisance animals such as opossums and raccoons. These animals are transported to a remote or rural location and released. The concern with this practice is the animals may return to the city and we have repeated calls for the same animal and also the idea that we are just moving our issue to a different location. One of the factors leading to this practice was the cost to the city for the care and eventual euthanasia of the cat. The Animal Shelter participates in a barn cat program. This would mean any feral cat will become property of the Animal Shelter and they would facilitate a Neuter/Spay service and provide the feral cat to a participating farmer for rodent control.

I have created a sheet to illustrate the fees that we commonly see involved in animal sheltering services. In addition to the services listed above, the fees will decrease as well.

ANIMAL SHELTERING SERVICES CONTRACT

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into this	day of	, 2024, by and between
Story County, Iowa (hereinafter "County") and the	City of Nevada	(hereinafter "City"), Iowa pursuant to
the authority, and by the procedures of Chapter 28E		

WHEREAS the City of Nevada has no building (structure) wherein the police department may receive or house domestic animals; and

WHEREAS Story County Animal Control has a building, located at 975 W. Lincoln Highway, Nevada, IA 50201; and

WHEREAS the County and City wish to enter into such an agreement for the receipt and housing of domestic animals in the Story County Animal Shelter building;

NOW, THEREFORE, the County and City do hereby agree as follows:

1. Authority:

The County, acting through its County Board of Supervisors, and the City, acting through its City Council, enter into this agreement pursuant to the powers granted to them under Chapter 28E of the Iowa Code.

2. Purpose:

Under this contract, Story County Animal Control shall provide said City with services of animal sheltering as set forth more specifically in succeeding paragraphs. Story County Animal Control will not provide service with regard to wild animals except as noted below in the Scope of Services, and in the sole discretion of Story County.

- 3. <u>Definitions (Story County Code of Ordinances):</u>
- 3.1. "Animal" shall mean a nonhuman vertebrate.
- 3.2. "Bite Animal" shall mean an animal that has bitten a human, provided that the bite punctured the skin.
- 3.3. "Cat" shall mean an animal fitting the scientific description felis catus.
- 3.4. "Companion Animal" shall mean any animal owned, confined, controlled or otherwise kept as a pet, but shall not include any livestock as defined under Iowa Code 717.1, or any game, furbearing animal, fish, reptile, or amphibian as defined under Iowa Code 481A.1.
- 3.5. "Dog" shall mean an animal fitting the scientific description canis lupus familiaris.

- 3.6. "Euthanasia" shall have the same meaning as defined under Iowa Code 162.2(13).
- 3.7. "Parties" shall mean both Story County and City of Nevada.
- 3.8. "Livestock" shall mean an animal belonging to the bovine, caprine, equine, ovine, porcine, or poultry.
- 3.9. "Shelter Services" shall mean providing adequate nutrition, water, shelter, and medical treatment to animals under the care of Story County Animal Shelter.

Scope of services:

- a. Story County Animal Shelter **shall** only respond to calls dispatched from the Story County Sheriff's office or the City of Nevada requesting drop off, retrieval, and/or impoundment of animals already confined and in custody of City employees and authorized by said City.
- b. Dog and Cat Shelter Services. The Story County Animal Shelter shall provide Shelter Services to dogs and cats delivered to its shelter location by the city.
- c. Stray Animal Pick-Up. Story County Animal Shelter will pick up confined stray domestic animals if needed between the hours of 8 a.m. 3:00 p.m. at request of City.
- d. Other Animal Shelter Services. The Story County Animal Shelter shall provide Shelter Services to other domestic animals, including Bite Animals, but only if the Story County Animal Shelter has proper accommodations and is properly licensed for that species.
- e. Holding Period and Automatic Transfer of Ownership. Unless the City instructs otherwise, the Story County Animal Shelter shall retain animals brought into the Animal Shelter by the City for seven days, or longer if so required by any state, county, or municipal law, ordinance, rule or regulation applicable in the geographic area in which the animal was seized (hereinafter referred to as the "Holding Period"). Once the Holding Period expires, the City of Nevada shall transfer ownership of the animal to Story County. This paragraph does not apply to "Bite Animals".
- f. Attempt to Identify and Notify Owner. Upon receipt of an animal delivered by the City and/or Story County staff, the Story County Animal Shelter shall first attempt to identify the owner of the animal and notify the owner; if found, of the seizure of that animal as well as the owner's right to redeem the animal.
- g. Redemption of Impounded Animal by Owner. The owner of an animal impounded at the Story County Animal Shelter shall have the right to redeem that animal, subject to he following conditions:
 - a. City-Issued Release. The Story County Animal Shelter shall require the redeeming owner to present proof of City Issued Release; and
 - b. Boarding Fees. The Story County Animal Shelter will collect any incurred boarding or other associated fee's directly from the owner prior to releasing the animal.
- h. Bite Animal Quarantine. Upon receipt of a Bite Animal, the Story County Animal Shelter shall keep the Bite Animal under quarantine for ten (10) days. During that period, the Story County Animal Shelter shall observe the Bite Animal for symptoms of rabies and other infectious diseases. Quarantined Bite Animals shall be released or euthanized only as directed by the City.
- i. Humane Euthanasia. For reasons of public safety, to relieve animal suffering or to address highly contagious diseases, the Story County Animal Shelter may humanely euthanize unclaimed, non-adopted animals. Further, any and all euthanasia procedures performed by Story County Staff shall be done in accordance with Iowa Code 162.2(13) and any other applicable state laws or rules.

 P.89

j. At the discretion of said City and Animal Control, an animal may be held and boarded for less than a minimum of seven (7) days if the animal is: Significantly sick or injured, vicious, feral/wild, believed to have been exposed to a disease infections to animals or humans.

k. Wild and Exotic Animals. The parties understand that the Story County Animal Shelter may be unable or unwilling to accept certain species of animals. These animals include all non-domesticated or wild animals and those animals considered dangerous or exotic as listed under

Story County Chapter 45.10.

 Unusual or Emergency Circumstances. Story County Animal Shelter may assist with rescue of animals in unusual or emergency circumstances (i.e. flood water, fire, etc. with permission from appropriate City Official).

m. Any domestic animals including but not limited to cats fitting the scientific description *felis* catus, or dogs fitting the scientific description canis lupus familiaris, that are lost, strayed, found, or trapped by the City shall not be released on private or public land without care sufficient to reasonably preserve the physical health and condition of the animals.

n. After-Hours Deliver Cages. The Story County Animal Shelter shall have available two (2) clean, secure dog cages and two (2) clean, secure cat cages with litter boxes for after-hours

deliveries, all of which supplied with fresh water.

o. The City understands that all services listed here are subject to the Animal Control Officer's availability and discretion.

5. Consideration (Animal Services Fee Schedule) (Quarterly Billing)

Story County will bill the City quarterly for services provided here under: The City will pay Story County, Iowa based on the following fee schedule:

- a. \$25 per trip for confined companion animal pick-ups within the city during business hours.
- b. \$50 per officer involved, per trip between the hours of 3 pm and 8 am, Monday through Friday, all day Saturday, Sunday and holidays for emergency assistance, or confined, companion animal pick-ups within the city.
- c. \$6.50 per day up to a maximum of seven (7) days per unclaimed dog for boarding.
- d. \$5.50 per day up to a maximum of seven (7) days per unclaimed cat for boarding.
- e. \$10.00 per day up to a maximum of seven (7) days per unclaimed head of livestock.
- f. \$15.00 for euthanasia of each unclaimed or unwanted cat not held for the entire seven (7) days due to sickness, injury, or rabies testing.
- g. \$25.00 for euthanasia of each unclaimed or unwanted dog not held for the entire seven (7) days due to sickness, injury, or rabies testing.
- h. \$5 per day for rental of humane cat trap.
- i. \$8 per day for rental of humane dog box trap.
- j. All diagnostic costs shall be paid by the City if such services are needed due to possible exposure to a suspected rabies or other infectious disease case.

6. Termination

Any party to this Agreement may terminate this Agreement by giving written notice to the other party at least ninety (90) days in advance of the date of termination.

7. <u>Effective Date</u>

This Agreement shall become effective upon its approval and execution by the County and City and its recording with the Story County Recorder and the Secretary of State for the State of Iowa pursuant to the requirements of Code of $I_{P,90}^{min}$ Chapter 28E.

8. Duration and Term

This Agreement shall be effective on the effective date listed above and shall continue until terminated by either party.

9. Notice

Any Notice required or authorized by this agreement, shall be in writing either personally delivered or sent by ordinary mail to the following addresses:

City of Nevada, Attn: City Administrator, 1209 6th St., Nevada, IA 50201

Story County, Administration Building, 900 6th St., Nevada, IA 50201

10. Savings Clause

If any section, provision or part of this agreement shall be found to be unconstitutional, such finding shall not affect the validity of the agreement as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not found to be invalid or unconstitutional.

11. Entire Agreement

This agreement represents the entire agreement between the parties as to the subject of this agreement. Any subsequent modification to the terms of this agreement shall be in the form of a duly executed Addendum to this agreement.

12. Amendments

This agreement may be amended at any time by mutual agreement of the parties. Any party desiring an amendment to this agreement shall notify the other party of its desire, and the reason for the request. Such a request shall be in writing to the other party, and shall be considered by the other party without unreasonable delay and within no more than (90) days of receipt.

13. Governing Law

This agreement shall be governed by and interpreted under the laws of the State of Iowa.

14. Signature Pages

The parties agree that this agreement has attached to it signature pages which shall be assembled and filed together with the agreement and shall together constitute one and the same instrument. A completed copy of the agreement with executed signature pages shall be sent to each party.

15. No Separate Entity Created

It is the intention of this Agreement that there be no new or additional legal or administrative entity created by this Agreement, nor that the inherent governmental powers or corporate powers of any party to this Agreement be affected in any way beyond the terms of this Agreement. Hello,

I believe that the previous contract (2014) provides a very good basis for a new contract. There are a few things that need to be updated or corrected.

One of the most challenging issues that we deal with is what to do with animals that are brought to the clinic that are never claimed. While we occasionally have a dog brought in that is not claimed, the vast majority of the animals that are not claimed are cats. One challenge we sometimes have is trying to find homes for some of the cats that are not claimed but are healthy and suitable for adoption. We have a shelter near Colfax that often can help out with that, but state laws limit our ability to send pets there in certain cases. Specifically, Iowa law will allow us to "adopt" pets to a shelter, but only if they are spayed or neutered. I.e. if we get kittens that are healthy and could be adopted but are too young to be spayed or neutered we cannot Adopt them out. However different rules apply to a municipal organization than to a veterinary clinic. A municipality can simply "donate" pets to a shelter and they do NOT have to be spayed or neutered, whereas we as a clinic are not allowed to do that. So I think we need to either have something in the contract that allow us to act as the agent for the city to initiate "donation" to the shelter, or when we have a situation where a pet could be donated to the shelter there is documentation for each case that the pet is still the property of the city and the city is donating that pet to the shelter. I suppose any city employee could do that. I would assume that in practical terms that would be you or perhaps Nancy. That of course would be up to your office to decide.

Using the "animal Care Agreement" dated May 12th 2014 as a starting point, I believe the following changes or additions need to be made:

Item 3. appears a little confusing to me. I believe it is intended to refer to when clinic staff is available when a pet is to be released or impounded. However it does not state that. I recommend removing the phrase "shall provide services" with "will be available to provide any services relating to animal incoming impoundment or dismissal from impoundment"

4 g. I would suggest increasing the maximum cost of treatment for a sick or injured pet from \$150 to whatever the city is willing to provide. \$150 does not provide a great deal of medical care.

also include "Dr. Murrell may provide any care that he deems customary and reasonable above and beyond that covered by the city as long and the city is not responsible for payment of those services above the limit provided in this paragraph."

also following the last line in the paragraph "The owner is responsible for all medical fees incurred" we need to add, "if the owner is not identified or is unable or unwilling to pay such fees, the city will be responsible for fees up to the amount specified in this paragraph"

Item 4 h. need to add: It will be the responsibility of the impounding officer to decide whether a sick or injured pet that is brought in after hours should be examined by Dr Murrell outside of regular clinic hours. If the officer determines that an exam is needed after hours and Dr. Murrell does such an exam after hours, the fee for an after hours exam as per appendix A shall apply.



ANIMAL CARE AGREEMENT

This agreement is entered into this 12th day of May, 2014, between the City of Nevada, Story County, Iowa, hereinafter, "City" and Paul Murrell, D.V.M., Nevada, Iowa, hereinafter "Dr. Murrell", d/b/a Nevada Veterinary Clinic, hereinafter "Clinic".

WHEREAS, the City has no facilities for keeping and caring for animals impounded by City officials; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Murrell does have such facilities available at his clinic; and

WHEREAS, the City and Dr. Murrell entered into an Agreement for services on the 1st day of April, 1991, which Agreement was approved by the City Council by Resolution No. 45 (90-91); and

WHEREAS, the City and Dr. Murrell amended the Agreement on December 6, 1993; and

WHEREAS, the City and Dr. Murrell amended the Agreement on April 8, 2002, and

WHEREAS, the City and Dr. Murrell amended the Agreement on April 24, 2006, and

WHEREAS, the City and Dr. Murrell amended the Agreement on May 12, 2014, and

WHEREAS circumstances have changed since the last Agreement, and the City and Dr. Murrell have negotiated a new Animal Care Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the City and Dr. Murrell mutually agree to the following:

- 1. All previous Agreements are cancelled upon the effective date of this agreement.
- 2. The term of this Agreement is from its execution by the parties for a term of three (3) years or until termination by either party giving the other party ninety (90) days prior written notice thereof.
- 3. Dr. Murrell and his staff shall provide services under this Agreement only during regular clinic hours. They shall not be available after the clinic is closed for the day, when closed on weekends or holidays, when closed for vacation or for any other reason except for emergency situations. During such times when Dr. Murrell and his staff are unavailable, the City's Public Safety Officers are hereby granted authority to enter the Clinic and release animals to their rightful owners after proper identification and payment of fines has been made. The City shall be responsible to collect any outstanding fees. The release of animals outside normal times will only be with permissing from the Chief of Police or his designee. Normal practice concerning the release of animals through the Nevada Public Safety Department will take place during the following hours and days:

Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday

8:30-5:00pm

Thursday

8:30-11:30am

- 5. Dr. Murrell shall issue a statement and invoices for his services to the City on a monthly basis in accordance with the schedule of fees provided in Appendix A of this Agreement. The City agrees to pay for undisputed invoices on a monthly basis. Dr. Murrell shall provide the invoice to the City on the "Record of Animal Impound" form provided by the City upon final disposition of the animal. Each invoice will include all fees for services provided each individual animal pursuant to this Agreement. The invoice shall state the disposition of each animal. Appendix A may be amended upon resolution of the Council without amending the entire agreement but may not be amended more than once annually.
- 6. The owner of the animal, if known, shall pay the cost of animals impounded by the City for rabies observation. If the owner of the animal is unknown, the City will pay the costs for ten (10) days.
- 7. On its website, the City shall post information on where and how to recover impounded animals. Dr. Murrell is in no way responsible to locate or identify the owner of any impounded animal. Any efforts on Dr. Murrell's behalf to locate owners are strictly voluntary and of a goodwill nature.
- 8. Any animal not claimed after seven (7) days shall be disposed of as follows:
 - a. On the seventh (7th) day of impoundment, Dr. Murrell shall make a determination whether or not the animal is suitable for adoption. Dr. Murrell shall consider the animal's disposition, age, health and general suitability as a pet in making his determination.
 - b. If Dr. Murrell does not elect to keep the animal for adoption, then the animal shall be euthanized on the eighth day of impoundment. If the eighth day falls on a Sunday or holiday, Dr. Murrell may elect to hold the animal until the next regular working day before euthanizing the animal. The City shall be responsible for the boarding on this additional day. The City shall pay for dogs to be held for up to three (3) additional days only if they are being donated to the lowa State University.
 - c. In the event Dr. Murrell elects to keep the animal for adoption, he may at his option, elect to keep the animal for adoption beyond the 7th day of impoundment without further expense to the City. In such event, he shall keep an accurate record of the date of such election and shall notify the City at the time of invoice. Any animal kept beyond the 7th day shall become the property of Dr. Murrell.
 - d. For purposes of this agreement, an impounded animal is not "claimed" until all impoundment fees, vaccination charges, daily boarding fees and all other fees have been paid in full to the city.
 - e. For purposes of this agreement, a "day" is calculated with 3:00 p.m. as the starting and stopping point. Wherefore, 3:00 p.m. is the cut-off time to pick up animals without incurring additional boarding costs. An animal picked up after 3:00 p.m. on any given day, will be charged for an additional half-day of expense.
- 9. The City shall provide Dr. Murrell with a supply forms designated "Record of Animal Impound" which form shall constitute the official record and history of each animal impounded at the Clinic by the City. Dr. Murrell agrees to keep such record for at least twenty-four (24) months and to indicate on record the disposition of the animal including the name of the owner claiming the animal, all fees charged to the City as a result of care for the animal, and if euthanized or adopted, the date of such disposition.

My family and I live in the country, southeast of Nevada, not too far from Hickory Grove Park. We are fond of animals, which is fortunate, because we welcome a steady stream of cats, and an occasional dog, which have been taken out into the country and dumped by owners (and apparently by officers) who no longer want, or perhaps can afford, their animals. We have been working with the Story County Animal Shelter, and, since we live outside of the corporate limits of Nevada, we live-trap these poor, frightened animals and bring them to shelter, warmth, and food at the shelter. The shelter gives its guests needed medical care, spaying or neutering as needed, and assesses them for pet quality. Those cats that are deemed too feral are found homes as barn cats with farmers, who are taught how to care for their charges. The shelter also has good success finding homes for the animals they have available for adoption.



HISTORY:

The current platform being utilized for permit entry is SimpleCity. The platform is unable to be accessed remotely. The platform is effect in collecting data or recalling previous permits. The platform is not link to the City's GIS. SimpleCity does not have the ability to track Nuisances or support the Rental Inspections. Currently Nuisances are tracked on an Excel form. The cost for SimpleCity is around 700 dollars annually.

Attached is an option for a new platform CloudPermit. This platform allows for permits, nuisances and rental inspections. The platform is cloud based and allows access remotely. The platform works with the City's GIS. The platform is able to sync with the City's website with permit submissions. The cost for this platform is 1,000 dollars for the set-up. The annual cost is 5,000 dollars per year.

Beacon Schneider is a web-based platform. It offers a similar setup to CloudPermit. \$3,800 setup \$13,404 per year. Includes hosting and support hours

GovBuilt is a web-based platform. GovBuilt has changed to MCCI. It offers the same setup as CloudPermit and Beacon Schneider. The setup cost is 10,000 dollars and 6,000 dollars per-year.

City Administrators Report

February 8-22, 2024

Wastewater Plant

We are getting closer and closer to the actual facility being done, they will plan on completing the punch list in March. Unfortunately, they are still working on the problems that occurred at the lift station. The most recent issue was they cut through a cable when fixing the hatches. The main issue is communication and inexperienced workers, which is something I stressed on Wednesday. While I appreciate them bringing in extra workers, I mentioned they need to bring in workers who have experience working on these types of projects because that is part of the problem. Erin is still working with their attorney on getting the warranty all buttoned up.

Unveiling Party

We had the unveiling party for the "Experience" Guide to Nevada magazine as well as announcing Pizza Pie looza Artists. Wasn't as big of a turnout as we hoped but there was still a good amount of people there. Very excited to have a community guide again, this was something listed in our 2040 plan.

Pizza Pie Looza

PPL Group announced that Sawyer Brown, Mark Wills, and Monica Austing will be here for this year's show. The Date is May 11, 2024. We did discuss having it sometime in June the following year due to weather conditions and do not want that to be a hindrance to attendance.

North Well Field

Shawn and I met with Josh Scanlon for HR Green to go over plans for the North Well Field. They will be starting soil tests very shortly to layout best locations for future wells. They were thinking either two or possibly three wells would fit in that particular acreage.

SCHT funds

Great news, we were awarded the 80k from SCHT so we will be able to kick off that program and have money to start awarding contracts. The plan is to go out on March 1 and have a deadline of May 31 for accepting applications. We will open it up again if additional funds are available.

Trails

You will be seeing a contract on the agenda to move forward with this project. Since HR Green helped with the initial grant we weren't awarded, they have already started working on the designs. We believe we have the amount down significantly to the original price which is helpful. This should keep us within the budget available we have been collecting on the trail levy.

Field House Tours

Rhonda and I met with community members and the City Administrator from Huxley last week and provided a tour of the field house. Rhonda has been showing a lot of people our new facility and it has been a hot topic. Both Tim and Rhonda have seen a big success with people attending and is full the majority of the time throughout the day and in the evening with activities.

Council Chambers

Met with Embark again to discuss the AV System in the Council Chambers. It is outdated and we do have issues more than not. I will be meeting with them again tomorrow (Friday) to discuss their proposal and will be able to provide more details during our council meeting on Monday.

Union

We went through initial Union proposals this last week and will be going through more on March 1st.

Urban Forestry Grant

Tim will be submitting the Urban Forestry Grant due on March 1st for the first round of trees. This grant will help with planting trees taken down from Derecho as well as adding some in city ROW. The plan was submitted calling for 17 trees at Evergreen Lane and on many trees on 6th street, starting on I Avenue headed south to the RR tracks.

Capstone Group

There is a purchase agreement in place so we are getting closer to the start of this project.

Trailside plans

OnTrack has been working on installing the sewer lines for this housing project, they are getting closer to finishing. They have been able to work faster than usual for this time of year due to no frost in the ground.

School Zones

Still working through the school zones, because it is a big area, I talked with Erin about how to write this ordinance and she is getting more information on this because typically, they are addressed through stop signs rather than areas, so we will not be seeing it on this agenda but hopefully the next.

Sponsored Project

Will be receiving bids in March for this project. We are working through getting easements for the areas or properties we do not currently have them on. Fortunately, there are some in place because of the trail.

Public Arts Commission

Met with this Committee for the second time, they are pinpointing locations in town that would serve as good locations for either murals or sculptures.

Well Field

Waiting to hear back from the people we contacted about this.

Lamar Signs

Erin and I went through the contract sent over. There are things I need to reach back out and get some clarification on as well as change certain language in the contract.
