

This is Nevada, Towa

You may say Ne-VAH-duh, but we encourage you to say Ne-VAY-duh, because that's how we pronounce the name of this incredible Central lowa community.

Our History

Even though the town was named after the Sierra Nevada mountains — pronounced like the state and the focus of the famed California Gold Rush — we think you'll agree you've struck gold when you come to our vibrant and thriving community of around 7,000 people.

Historically, Nevada was founded in October of 1853 when the T.E. Alderman family moved into the first structure to be built here. That structure, a log cabin, is preserved on Nevada's historical property, Evergreen Lane/Briggs Terrace, along H Avenue in the heart of town. It is also interesting to note that one of Nevada's upcoming Main Street District restaurants, T.E. Alderman's, chose its name to honor the founding family.

By 1913, Nevada was one of the cities fortunate to have the newly completed Lincoln Highway — the first transcontinental highway — going through our town, bringing motorists through the community from all across the country. Nevada was also on the original Jefferson Highway route, a north-south highway through the middle of the United States, which was completed a few years after the Lincoln Highway. The community has paid tribute to the two historic highways by naming the park in front of City Hall the Lincoln-Jefferson

Highways Heritage Park, by having a historical Lincoln Highway marker at the corner of the City Hall property, and educational placards about both historic highways by the park fence. The community has played host to various groups that make special commemorative trips along the two highways.

Nevada's central location was not only important for highways, but also played a part in the town's rich railroad history. Nevada was historically served by the Chicago & North Western Railroad on lines north of the business district. The town was also on the route of the Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific Railroad's "Spine Line," which traveled between Minneapolis and Kansas City, Mo. The Union Pacific Railroad presently operates both active rail lines.

Nevada Today

Nevada, lowa is the second largest community in Story County behind the nearby City of Ames (over 66,000). Being close to Ames, which is the home of Iowa State University, gives Nevada residents the beauty of living in a smaller town, while being close to all the sports and cultural amenities of a university and a larger metropolitan area.

Nevada is the county seat of Story County, with the majority of County services being headquartered in the community.

Nevada, much like in its historic days of railroads and major highways, is still close to major transportation systems. You can access Interstate 35, a major north-south highway, by





driving just seven miles west of Nevada. You can access US Highway 30, which is four-lane in many parts of the state, right at Nevada, since it runs through our community. And the railroads? We still have active lines going through town.

Nevada is home to over a dozen major manufacturers, and we also are the chosen home of many ag-businesses, which is not surprising given we are in the heartland of the country and Iowa. The Nevada Economic Development Council is very active pursuing the types of businesses that can provide employment opportunities and add to our tax base. We boast a large industrial park area on the west edge of town.

Nevada is a Main Street Iowa community, having earned this designation and with the esteemed Main Street program in

2019. The timing was perfect as the City of Nevada was planning to complete a two-year, \$9 million reconstruction project in the Main Street District in 2020 and 2021. This project included all new underground infrastructure in the downtown area, as well as newly paved streets and sidewalks, new decorative light posts, new downtown electrical hookups and more. Nevada's downtown property owners have received around 15 grants, since 2019, to further improve this district. Many grant funds are going toward modern upper-level housing units in renovated historic buildings.

MAY

Pizza Pie Looza — First celebrated in 2022, this new event brought in headliner acts JoDee Messina in 2022 and the Roots and Boots tour of Aaron Tippin, Collin Raye and Sammy Kershaw in 2023. Happening in the Main Street District, the afternoon is filled with vendors, especially food vendors, and local businesses offering all kinds of pizza and pie treats, and more. Families can enjoy kids' activities, and free music acts performing on the small stage all afternoon. Purchase a ticket to enjoy the big evening concert in front of City Hall. Memorial Day Observance — Overseen by the Patriotic Council, Nevada celebrates Memorial Day with a flag raising in the downtown area, a processional to the City Cemetery, and a service with music and presenters at the City Cemetery. Services are usually followed by a meal at the American Legion Post on Sixth Street, with proceeds benefiting veteran organizations. Watch the Our Nevada magazine and the City of Nevada, IA Facebook

JUNE

Music at the Mansion — This event was first featured in 2022, after being delayed by the pandemic. It is held on the beautiful front lawn of the Evergreen Lane/Briggs Terrace property along H Avenue. Several music performers/bands play in the

late afternoon and evening. Food is offered by vendors, and there are usually other vendors selling specialty items. Bring a lawn chair and bring the kids, because this relaxing event under the shade of many large trees is perfect for all ages. City-Wide Garage Sale — Normally the first or second Saturday in June is designated as the official City-Wide Garage Sale Day (or weekend!!) in our community. This is a great time to have a garage sale if you have things to clear out, or to attend a lot of garage sales in the community if you want to browse other people's treasures! Nevada High School Alumni Reunion — Traditionally held the last weekend of June, this annual gathering is for every alum, but usually has special recognition of the classes celebrating 5- or 10-year incremental reunions. JULY

Fourth of July — Nevada offers some very traditional activities for Independence Day. A 10 a.m. morning parade comes north on Sixth Street from E to N Avenue. The parade is followed by the American Legion Auxiliary's Chicken & Noodle Dinner, offering homemade pies, plus root beer floats! The evening features the City Fireworks Show at

Story County Fair — Nevada is home to the annual Story County Fair, which happens in mid to late July. People can see announcement of the dates each year and a schedule by following the Story County Fair Board website: https://sc-fair.weebly.com/story-county-fair.html. Story County's

fair is free to all who want to walk through the grounds, look at the animals and other fair exhibits, and enjoy on-site food vendors.



AUGUST

Lincoln Highway Days — Held the last "full" weekend of August, Lincoln Highway Days has been an annual tradition for 40 years and counting. The Saturday morning parade along the Lincoln Highway (from 15th Street to 1st Street, travels east to west and starts at 10 a.m.) is always well attended. Most events are held in the Story County Fairgrounds area on the west side of Nevada. The award-winning

Nevada Community Rodeo is Saturday night in the rodeo arena at the fairgrounds. A carnival and food vendors are favorites, too. Learn more about the full schedule each August at the website: lincolnhighwaydays.org.

SEPTEMBER/OCTOBER

Nevada High School's Homecoming Week — Homecoming, which has many activities for students and community, is generally celebrated sometime in September. Watch for more details about the parade, the big game, and other activities on the Nevada Community School District website: nevadacubs.org, and Facebook page: NevadaCSD.

CROP Walk — Help raise money to fight hunger world-wide and

locally. This event is organized by a group of Nevada churches, and seeks involvement from walkers, who will both walk symbolically and to gather donations from family and friends to give to this cause.



Pregnancy & Infant

Loss Remembrance Walk — Nevada's Cub Stadium serves as the site for a local walk, where participants join with others across the world to create a "Wave of Light" as they remember lives lost to miscarriage, Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS), stillbirth, ectopic pregnancy, termination of pregnancy for medical reasons, and the death of a newborn. Downtown Trick-or-Treat — Bring the whole family and wear your costumes. On a date close to Halloween, our Main Street District comes to life with businesses and organizations with treats lining the streets. The event usually includes several fun activities, like costume contests, pet costume contest, and more. It is free to attend. Learn more by following the Main Street Nevada, IA page on Facebook.

Residential Trick-or-Treat — Each year the City sets a residential trick-or-treat night on or near the Halloween holiday. On the date set, trick-or-treating is offered throughout the City from 6-8 p.m. at all residences where the porch light is on.

NOVEMBER

Women Helping Others Craft Fair — This is a long-standing tradition in the community, with the small admission fee supporting scholarships for area seniors. Plan to attend the yearly event on the second weekend of the month. It features a variety of vendors, selling all kinds of crafts and other unique products. Parks and Recreation's Thanksgiving Meal — All senior residents of the community are invited, along with their guests, to attend this meal, which has been held for 20+ years. The meal features all the traditional Thanksgiving feast menu items: Turkey, mashed potatoes,


DECEMBER

Christmas On Main — This Main Street Nevada event started in 2021 and received rave reviews. Its main goal is to let every participating business in the Main Street District (and some who come from other areas of the community) share a little bit of magic inside their building. 
Josephine Tope Community Auditorium, located at Nevada High School, 825 15th Street



City Parks: The City has eight established parks, along with several other public spaces to enjoy outdoor relaxation and activities. The biggest of the City Parks is SCORE, located off Fawcett Parkway on the east side of Nevada. SCORE includes: the pavilion and pond gathering place, four-plex ball fields, soccer fields, high school baseball field, tennis/pickleball courts, basketball court, Fawcett Family Aquatic Center, two outdoor playgrounds, and the new Field House with indoor recreation opportunities, including an upper level track, and on the main floor, a young children's playground area, and both hard-surface courts and turf area fields. SCORE is also the east end of the Indian Creek Greenbelt Trail system through Nevada. Learn more: CityofNevadalowa.org

City Trail System & Nevada Story Stroll: The Indian Creek Greenbelt Trail system is over 4 miles of paved trail that runs across the community along Indian Creek. The trail is open to walkers and bikers, but motorized vehicles are not allowed. On the west side of town is a trail loop directly west of the City Cemetery, and on that loop is the Nevada Public Library's Story Stroll, featuring a new children's picture book every six to eight weeks during warmer months. 



Nevada Rublic Schools



Nevada Public Schools is the largest "education system" in Nevada, offering education for pre-school age through high school. The local school district has about 1,500 students and 250 staff members. All of the school's facilities have been updated in recent years. All facilities are ADA-accessible, climate-controlled with air conditioning, and offer the latest technology. State of the art facilities such as the Josephine Tope Community Auditorium, athletic stadiums and gymnasiums, regional welding lab, greenhouse and ag/mech lab are among the best in Class 3A.

At the elementary level, the school district promotes having the following "specials": art, physical education, music, and social development. Support systems, from reading specialists to counselors, are available for all students. Technology is also emphasized, even at this early level. Starting in kindergarten, students are issued a computer to facilitate and enhance their learning.

It's worth noting that Central Elementary School in Nevada is a nationally recognized showcase school for Capturing Kids' Hearts, a program that puts staff relationships with kids as a top priority.

At the middle school level, which in Nevada consists of students in grades 5th through 8th, students take part in the LeadWorthy Character curriculum, which is designed to inspire and empower students to lead with heart. Athletics and fine arts opportunities are emphasized at this level, with coordinated sports programs offered to 7th and 8th graders. Middle school students also have unique fine arts opportunities, including plays, musicals, art, band, and choir.

At the high school level, NCSD continues to offer a number of robust co-curricular and extra-curricular opportunities for students, such as fine arts, athletics, FFA, robotics, Key Club, and trapshooting, to name a few. Nevada's programs have a strong tradition of earning area- and state-wide recognition.

Nevada High School is proud to offer over 100 college-credit courses, as well as robust career-ready programming such as internships, apprenticeships, and Iowa Jobs for America's Graduates (iJAG).




