
LOCATION MAP

ASSISTING CONSTRUCTION OR REHABILITATION OF HOUSING IN COMMUNITIES WITH WORKFORCE HOUSING NEEDS

This program provides tax benefits to developers to provide housing in Iowa communities, focusing especially on those projects using abandoned, empty or dilapidated properties. A Small Cities set aside for this program is available to eligible projects within the 88-least populous counties in Iowa.

- Total program benefits limited to \$1 million per project
- Tax incentives include a refund of sales, service or use taxes paid during construction
- Developers may receive a state investment tax credit of up to 10% of the investment
 directly related to the construction or rehabilitation of the housing. Developers qualifying
 under the Small Cities set aside may receive an investment tax credit of up to 20% of the
 investment directly related to the construction or rehabilitation of the housing. The state
 investment tax credit is fully transferable.
 - Federal, state or local grants, tax credits, forgivable loans or other assistance not requiring repayment cannot be included for the purposes of calculating new investment
- Tax credit is based on the new investment used for the first \$150,000 of value for each home or unit

Who Qualifies?

- Projects must meet one of four criteria:
 - Housing development located on a grayfield or brownfield site
 - o Repair or rehabilitation of dilapidated housing stock
 - Upper story housing development
 - o New construction in a greenfield site.
- Developer must build or rehabilitate at least four single-family homes or at least one multi-family building containing three or more units or at least two upper story units
- This program has a per unit cost cap to ensure units created under the program are workforce housing

For FY 2024, project costs may not exceed the following per unit cost caps:

single family unit in an urban area	\$298,021
single family unit in a small city	\$298,021
multi-family unit in an urban area	\$241,643
multi-family unit in a small city	\$241,643

- Historic preservation projects may not exceed 125% of the maximum per unit cost established based on project type and location
- The housing project must be completed within three years from the date of award
- The housing units must be for owner or renter occupied permanent residence, and not offered for rent on a daily or weekly basis.

ORDINANCE NO. 1056 (2023/2024)

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 62 (GENERAL TRAFFIC REGULATIONS)
OF THE CITY CODE BY ESTABLISHING SCHOOL ZONES IN CERTAIN AREAS OF TOWN

BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Nevada, Iowa, as follows:

SECTION 1. SECTION MODIFIED. Chapter 62 (General Traffic Regulations), Section 62.13 (School Zones Established), Is hereby amended by adding new underlined language:

62.13 School Zones Established. The following school zones are established to include the parts of streets herein set forth:

- A. Central Elementary
 - a. On the northwest corner of 8th Street and K Avenue to the southwest corner of 8th and G Avenue; on G Avenue to the southeast corner of G Avenue and 11th Street; on 11th Street to the southeast corner of 11th Street and H Avenue; on the southside of H Avenue to the southeast corner of 12th Street and H Avenue to the northeast corner of 12th Street and K Avenue; on K Avenue to the northwest corner of 8th Street and K Avenue.
- B. Nevada Middle and High School
 - a. On the southeast corner of 12th Street and H Avenue to the intersection of 19th Street and H Avenue; on the northeast corner of 15th Street to the southeast corner of 15th Street and Lincoln Highway; approximately 590 feet east on Lincoln highway to the northside of Lincoln Highway to the northwest corner of 15th and Lincoln Highway; on 15th Street to the northwest corner of 15th Street and K Avenue; on K Avenue to the northeast corner of K Avenue and 12th Street.

SECTION 2. REPEALER. All ordinances or parts or ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 4. WHEN EFFECTIVE. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

EASEMENT OPTION AGREEMENT

For good and other valuable consideration, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, City of Nevada, Iowa, 1209 6th Street, Nevada, IA 50201 ("Grantor") and ITC MIDWEST LLC, a Michigan limited liability company, whose address is 27175 Energy Way, Novi, Michigan 48377 ("Grantee" enter into this option agreement ("Agreement") for an easement across land owned by Grantor on the attached Exhibit A located in the County of Story and the State of Iowa ("Premises"). The Grantor and Grantee are at times collectively referred to hereinafter as the "Parties" or individually as the "Party."

RECITALS

- A. Grantor is the owner of the Premises.
- B. Grantee desires to obtain an option for an easement for constructing, operating and maintaining a transmission line on, under, over, through and across an area of varying width located on the property within the shaded area depicted on Exhibit A (the "Easement Area"). The Easement Area shall be more particularly described in the survey to be obtained by Grantee pursuant to Section 3 of this Agreement;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the sum of \$165.00 (One hundred sixty-five dollars and zero cents) (the "Initial Option Payment"), to be paid by Grantee to the Grantor, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and adequacy of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

- 1. **Grant of Option**. Grantor hereby grants to Grantee the right and option ("Option") to obtain a non-exclusive easement on, under, over, through and across the Easement Area. The Initial Option Payment shall be made by Grantee to Grantor upon Grantor's execution of this Agreement.
- 2. **Exercise of Option**. The Option may be exercised in writing at any time within twelve (12) months after the date of this Agreement ("Initial Option Period"). Grantee shall not be required to exercise the Option. Grantee shall have the right to extend the Initial Option Period for one additional twelve (12) month-period (the "Extended Option Period") by providing written notice to Grantor on or before the last day of the Initial Option Period, together with an additional payment for the extension in the amount of \$165.00 (the "Option Extension Payment" and together with the Initial Option Payment, collectively, the "Option Payment"). The Initial Option Period and the Extended Option Period, as applicable, shall be collectively referred to in this Agreement as the "Option Period". The Option Period may be further extended by mutual agreement in writing of the Parties. Should Grantee fail to exercise this Option within the Option Period, all rights and privileges granted hereunder shall be deemed completely surrendered, this Agreement terminated, and Grantor shall retain the Option Payment, and no additional money shall be payable by either Party to the other.
- 3. **Grantee's License**. As of the date of this Agreement, Grantor grants to Grantee, its agents and employees a non-exclusive license (the "License") the right of ingress and egress over and across Premises to conduct such surveys, inspections and tests on the Easement Area as Grantee deems necessary, including but not limited to soil borings and environmental studies, to determine whether or not it wishes to exercise the Option granted herein. Grantee shall exercise its rights of ingress and egress via existing field roads and lanes, if any, otherwise by the use of the most reasonable and feasible route selected by Grantee in its reasonable discretion. Grantor grants to Grantee the right to construct a temporary road, at Grantee's sole expense, across the route used for ingress and egress, provided that upon the later of Grantee's determination that a temporary road is no longer

necessary and Grantor's request to remove, Grantee shall, to the extent reasonably practicable, restore any temporary road area to its condition at the time of entering into this Agreement. Grantee agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold Grantor harmless from any and all loss, claim, action, demand and liability relating to or arising out of Grantee's, or its agents', employees', representatives' or contractors' entry upon the Easement Area under this paragraph which may arise against Grantor. If Grantee determines, in its sole and absolute discretion, that the condition of the Premises is not acceptable to Grantee, then Grantee may, at any time prior to expiration of the Option Period, terminate this Agreement by giving Grantor written notice of termination, in which event neither party shall have any further liability hereunder.

- 4. Damages and Repair. Upon reasonable notice to Grantee that damage has occurred on the Premises, Grantor and Grantee shall work cooperatively to identify the damage and to determine the scope of repair or replacement work and/or amount of reimbursement. Notwithstanding the foregoing, at no time shall Grantee be responsible for any damages to the extent that such damage results from Grantor's negligence or willful misconduct. Consistent with lowa Code and as provided in Grantee's most current damages statement, Grantee shall:
 - re-grade, repair and restore, at Grantee's sole expense, any portions of the Premises damaged by Grantee in the exercise of any of Grantee's rights in this Agreement;
 - (ii) repair or replace, at Grantee's sole expense, any property damaged, including but not limited to any actual damage done to drain tiles or other farming equipment (collectively referred to as "Equipment") caused by Grantee's exercise of any of Grantee's rights under this Agreement. In lieu of the foregoing, Grantor may elect to undertake such repair or replacement of the Equipment and Grantee shall reimburse the Grantor for the actual and reasonable cost of such repair or replacement; and
 - (iii) upon Grantee's completion of construction, operation, maintenance, repair, reconstruction or use of the electric lines, Grantee shall reimburse Grantor, or the owner of the crops if different from the Grantor, for the value of any crops damaged by Grantee's exercise of any of Grantee's rights under this Agreement.
- 5. **Execution of Easement.** Upon the execution of this Agreement by Grantor, Grantor shall also execute and deliver the Overhang Easement to Grantee in the form attached hereto as Exhibit B (the "Easement"). Grantee agrees to hold the Easement in escrow and agrees not to record the Easement in the Office of the Recorder where the Easement Area is located until Grantee exercises the Option pursuant to Section 2 of this Agreement and, pays the Easement Payment to Grantor as set forth in Section 6 below. If Grantee exercises the Option, Grantee shall record the Easement with the County Recorder.
- 6. **Easement Consideration**. Should Grantee exercise this Option, Grantee shall, as consideration for the granting of the Easement described in Section 5, pay to Grantor the sum of \$1,650.00 (One thousand six hundred fifty dollars and zero cents) less the Option Payment, which amount shall be paid within thirty (30) days of the date of Grantee's notice to Grantor that Grantee is exercising the Option pursuant to Section 2 (the "Easement Consideration").
- 7. **Notification of Grant of Interest.** Grantor agrees to notify Grantee at least 10 days prior to granting any easement, lease, or other restriction on the use of the Premises or entering into any contract to sell all or a portion of the Premises. The rights to the Easement Payment as provided in Section 6 above belong to the Grantor, its successors and assigns. For Grantee to recognize any assignment of those rights to a subsequent purchaser of the Premises there must be a validly executed assignment of those rights by the Grantor(s)

and a copy of that assignment must be provided to Grantee before the Option is exercised.

8. **Notices.** Notice of the exercise of the Option shall be given by Grantee to the Grantor in writing by (1) certified mail, return receipt requested, or (2) overnight courier, provided the courier's regular business provides delivery service at the addresses set forth above. Notice shall be deemed effective on the date it is sent. The address for Grantor for purposes of such notice is as follows:

Other notices pursuant to this agreement shall be sent by the United States Postal Service First Class mail to the Grantor at the above-listed address and to Grantee at:

- 9. Representations and Warranties. Grantor represents and warrants to Grantee that it is the sole owner(s) of the Premises; that it holds the Premises by title in fee simple; that it has the full authority and power to grant the Easement to Grantee; and that the Premises are free and clear of all liens, encumbrances, claims and charges (including, but not limited to, judgment liens, judicial liens, mechanic's liens, harvester's liens, miner's liens, landlord's liens, attorney's liens, tax liens, and special assessments). Grantor covenants to warrant and defend the Premises and Easement against any liens and the lawful claims of all persons asserting, claiming or having any liens. Grantor hereby relinquishes all rights of dower, homestead and distributive share in and to the Easement.
- 10. Integration/Severability. It is agreed and understood that this Agreement contains all agreements, promises and understandings between Grantor and Grantee and that no verbal or oral agreements, promises or understandings shall be binding upon either Grantor or Grantee in any dispute, controversy or proceeding at law, and any addition, variation or modification to this Agreement shall be void and ineffective unless made in writing signed by the Grantor and Grantee. In the event any provision of the Agreement is found to be invalid or unenforceable, such finding shall not affect the validity and enforceability of the remaining provisions of this Agreement. The failure of either party to insist upon strict performance of any of the terms or conditions of this Agreement or to exercise any of its rights under the Agreement shall not waive such rights and such party shall have the right to enforce such rights at any time and take such action as may be lawful and authorized under this Agreement, in law or in equity.
- 11. **Captions**. The captions contained in this Agreement are inserted for convenience only and are not intended to be part of the Agreement. They shall not affect or be utilized in the construction or interpretation of the Agreement.
- 12. **Governing Law.** This Agreement and the performance thereof shall be governed, interpreted, construed and regulated by the laws of the State of Iowa.
- 13. **Binding Effect.** This conveyance shall run with the land and shall be binding upon the parties' successors, personal representatives, heirs, and assigns.

14. **Memorandum of Option**. Grantor agrees to execute a Memorandum of this Agreement which Grantee may record with the appropriate Office of the Recorder in the County where the Easement Area is located. The date set forth in the Memorandum is for recording purposes only and bears no reference to commencement of the term of the Option Period.



OVERHANG EASEMENT

For good and other valuable consideration, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, **City of Nevada, Iowa,** 1209 6th Street, Nevada, IA 50201 ("Grantor"), does hereby warrant and convey unto ITC Midwest LLC, a Michigan limited liability company, 27175 Energy Way, Novi, MI 48377 ("Grantee"), a perpetual non-exclusive overhang easement ("Easement") upon, over and across the "Easement Area" within the "Premises" as described below and shown on <u>Exhibit A</u>, together with all the rights and privileges for the full enjoyment or use thereof for the purpose described below.

Premises: Right of way located in the Southeast ¼ of the Southeast ¼ of Section 4, Township 83 North, Range 23 West of the 5th P.M., Story County, Iowa, more particularly described as follows: Beginning at the Southeast corner of the Southeast ¼ of the Southeast ¼ of said Section 4; thence, S89°43′23″W 214.57′ along the South line of the Southeast ¼ of the Southeast ¼ of said Section 4; thence, N0°16′37″W 50.00′ to the North right of way line of Lincoln Highway, as presently established, also being the point of beginning; thence, N72°00′00″E 124.84′; thence, N89°43′23″E 56.42′; thence, N1°04′21″W 25.00′; thence, N89°43′23″E 5.00′ to the West right of way line of 590th Avenue, as presently established; thence, S1°04′21″E 63.00′ along said West right of way line to the North right of way line of Lincoln Highway, as presently established; thence, S89°43′23″W 180.87′ along said North right of way line to the point of beginning, containing 0.11 acres. Subject to easements and restrictions of record, if any.

Easement Area: See Exhibit A for Easement Area.

- 1. **Grant of Rights**. The Easement shall include the following rights:
 - (i) The right, privilege and authority to construct, reconstruct, maintain, operate, repair, patrol and remove electric and telecommunication lines (but including no right or privilege to place poles, towers or other structures in contact with the ground within the premises described), for transmission and distribution of electricity, communications and all corporate purposes (the "Electric Lines");
 - (ii) The right to enter upon the Premises to conduct surveys, including environmental surveys, and soil engineering testing for the Electric Lines;

- (iii) The right to remove, cut, trim, destroy or otherwise control any or all trees, shrubs, bushes, or brush now or hereafter standing or growing upon or within the Easement Area, all at Grantee's sole and absolute discretion, together with the right to remove, cut, trim, destroy or otherwise control any or all trees, shrubs, bushes, or brush on the Premises that in the sole and absolute judgment of the Grantee may interfere with maintenance, operation, or use of the Electric Lines or which in falling might touch the Electric Lines; and
- (iv) The right of ingress and egress over and across the Premises to the Easement Area for any of the Easement purposes stated herein, by means of existing field roads and lanes, if any, otherwise by the use of the most reasonable and feasible route selected by Grantee in its reasonable discretion, together with the right to construct a temporary road, at Grantee's sole expense, across the route used for ingress and egress, provided that upon the later of Grantee's determination that a temporary road is no longer necessary and Grantor's request to remove, Grantee shall, to the extent reasonably practicable, restore any temporary road area to its condition at the time of entering into this Agreement;
- (v) Upon written notice to Grantor, the right to extend any or all of the rights granted in this Easement to another entity or person for purposes of constructing, reconstructing, operating, maintaining and removing the Electric Lines.
- 2. **Reserved Rights**: Grantor reserves the right to cultivate, use, install and maintain field tiles or other drainage apparatuses used for farming, and occupy the Easement Area in a manner that is not inconsistent with Grantee's rights granted herein, provided that Grantor shall not perform any act which will interfere with or endanger the Electric Lines.
- 3. **Survey**. For one hundred eighty (180) days after completion of construction of the transmission line, Grantee shall have the right, but not the obligation, to supplement Exhibit A with a new Exhibit A-1 that will show the exact size and location of the Easement Area as determined by survey of the legal description set forth above. The survey shall be in such form and content as is acceptable to Grantee in its sole discretion. Grantor hereby agrees that Grantee shall have the right to and is hereby authorized, with or without the joinder of Grantor, to file Exhibit A-1 by affidavit, to amend this Easement to include such new Exhibit A-1 or to attach such new Exhibit A-1 to this Easement, and to record or rerecord such affidavit, amendment or Easement with the new Exhibit A-1. Grantee shall provide Grantor with a copy of the recorded affidavit, amendment or re-recorded Easement.
- 4. Damages and Repair. Upon reasonable notice to Grantee that damage has occurred on the Premises, Grantor and Grantee shall work cooperatively to identify the damage and to determine the scope of repair or replacement work and/or amount of reimbursement. Notwithstanding the foregoing, at no time shall Grantee be responsible for any damages to the extent that such damage results from Grantor's negligence or willful misconduct. Consistent with lowa Code and as provided in Grantee's most current damages statement, Grantee shall:
 - (i) re-grade, repair and restore, at Grantee's sole expense, any portions of the Premises damaged by Grantee in the exercise of any of Grantee's rights in this Easement;
 - (ii) repair or replace at Grantee's sole expense any property damaged, including but not limited to any actual damage done to drain tiles or other farming equipment (collectively referred to as "Equipment") caused by Grantee's exercise of any of Grantee's rights under this Easement. - (iii) upon Grantee's completion of construction, operation, maintenance, repair, reconstruction or use of the Electric Lines, Grantee shall reimburse Grantor, or the owner of the crops if different from the Grantor, for the value of any crops damaged by Grantee's exercise of any of Grantee's rights under this Easement.
- 5. Structures, Trees, Permitted Fences. Grantor shall not erect any buildings, structures or other objects, permanent or temporary, (collectively referred to herein as "Structures") upon the Easement Area nor to perform any act which will interfere with or endanger the Electric Lines. Grantor further agrees not to plant any trees within the Easement Area without prior express written consent from Grantee, nor to perform any act which will interfere with or endanger the Electric Lines.

Grantee may remove, at its sole discretion, any existing Structures from the Easement Area. In addition, Grantee may remove, at its sole discretion, any prohibited future Structures from the Easement Area without prior notice and without responsibility for any damage that occurs as a result of such removal. In the event a fence currently exists within the Easement Area as of the date of this Easement (each, a "Permitted Fence"), Grantee may: (1) install and maintain a gating system in the Permitted Fence, of Grantee's choice, in order to obtain access to the Easement Area for the purposes of construction and maintenance of the Electric Lines; and (2) cause such Permitted Fence to be removed as Grantee deems necessary provided that Grantee restores such Permitted Fence to substantially the same condition as it existed prior to removal.

- 6. Public Improvements. 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City Administrators Report

May 8-22, 2024

Tornado

This was tragic, fortunately, we did not see any damage in the city limits of Nevada. Unfortunately, there was quite a bit of damage on the outskirts. Ray provided a count of 42 properties affected with 4 total houses being flattened or moved. We have opened the northwest portion of the new wastewater site for tree debris and will be working on getting a permit to burn the pile.

19th street trail

Bids came in and will be set to approve, the lowest bid was for a total contract price of approximately 400k. This is a good price considering the original was proposed to be \$1.5 million.

Railroad

I have updated the sections on the document they have requested for the update and Ryan has sent everything off to FRA, IDOT, and UP. We certified the letters so we will know when they are received.

WW plant

We did see some damage at the new plant. Fortunately, the plant is not "owned" by the city so we will not have to file a claim under our insurance. We have yet to accept the project so WBCI will be taking care of the damages. WBCI should be capable of getting everything fixed or replaced before the lift station is complete. When I spoke with the contractor today, they mentioned the insurance adjuster will be here on Thursday to assess the damages. It appears to be cosmetic rather than structural, which is good but they have not finished the overall assessment of the building. I will provide updates when I have more information. From what I saw, the roofs will need to be replaced, there is some damage to the exterior of both tin buildings but WBCI still believes everything is operational.

School Zones

This is on the agenda for the first reading.

AV System Council Chambers

GeoTab

We have ordered and are waiting for the shipment to arrive.

Trailside

As noted, the first house has been built in the development and is waiting for the garage to be constructed. There should be additional houses starting shortly. We have received plans already for this to happen.

Northview

The final plat has been submitted and HR Green is reviewing.

Burke

Our work session with Burke will take place at our next council meeting on Tuesday the 28th.

4th Graders

The Mayor, Joe, Chris, Erin, and I went to Central Elementary School last week to speak with the 4th-grade classes and provide a little show-and-tell of city equipment. I think their favorite part was seeing some of the equipment and vehicles.

Storage Containers/Conex containers

There has been talk with other communities that have seen an influx of storage containers coming into communities. There have been some places where ordinances have been put in place. The two I am aware of are Humboldt and Decorah. I am wondering if there is any interest in doing so here. This has been a topic of discussion in the past but am asking for more feedback from the council before I start this.

Merchant McIntyre

I spoke with this firm; they specialize in getting grants for communities on various projects. I will be speaking with staff to see if this is of any interest. There is a monthly retainer and is costly, but would pay off if we were rewarded grants for the projects. They specialize in a lot of different areas. The areas I would like to utilize them in would be trails, water infrastructure, and police.

AEDC

Met with Greg Piklapp who works for AEDC and discussed issues about funding certain projects. He will be going to Washinton DC and talking about what Congress can do to help with funding for future projects or suggestions on grants that may provide a little relief while constructing or tearing down.

Upper Story Grants

Emily, Andrew Collings, and I met with property owners downtown to gauge interest on applying for an upper-story grant for downtown. Three people showed up, one person is interested in applying, but the other two parties are interested in the Façade grant.

Nevada Public Library Council Report

- We've ended our Summer Learning Challenge sponsorship campaign and have raised \$5300 to fund summer reading. See the attached photo for sponsors and be sure to thanks them! We've also gotten coupons from great local businesses including Subway, Bricktown, Starbuck's, Casey's, Texas Roadhouse, Sweet & Savory, Pool Passes from Parks & Rec, Blank Park Zoo Passes, and iCubs tickets. Dog-Eared Books in Ames donated gift certificates and swag for our teen prizes.
- Building Maintenance with our fax line being ported to American Business phones, we had to install a cellular dialer on our fire alarm panel. We had Marshalltown Alarms complete this and we are going to run on a 6 month contract for inspections and alarm monitoring with them until we can get all city departments on the same contract. I was incredibly impressed with Bill from Marshalltown Alarms and his ability to prioritize us when our building alarms were no longer being monitored.
- We have had a few more leaks in our roof with the rain. Central States has assured me that there are voids in the membrane due to the cracks in the skylights and we plan to replace those in FY 2025 to hopefully solve the roof problems.
- Three of our high school clerks graduated and will be working their last days in the next few weeks and we've hired three new clerks who have started training. Congratulate Hayden Cheek, Kaelyn Banks, and Aloria Cornelius if you see them, and welcome Dexter Walker, Cameron Spence, and Becky Buteau to the library!
- I've been accepted to be part of the Association of Rural and Small Libraries Leadership Institute. With this, I'll be doing a lot of work training to become a better library leader, engaging with other library leaders across the country for approximately five hours a month of activities; I'll also be able to attend the 2024 and 2025 ARSL Conferences which are in September. This year it's in Massachusetts. All fees, lodging, flights, etc. are paid for by the ARSL. Finally, I'll complete a Leadership Project at the library.
- Library board members each plan to attend at least 1 council meeting per year so there is always a representative at the council meetings; Emily Fulton will be there on May 28th if you have any questions for her. We'd love to have a council member attend our board meetings as well so we can have a strong and lasting relationship between the city and library.
